OPERATING RESULTS

We are pleased to inform that your Company has continued to maintain a growth momentum, both in turnover and profits, during the year under review. Sales revenue and profit after tax increased by Rs. 1,878 Million and Rs. 30 Million respectively, as compared to last year. Net earnings per share rose from Rs. 6.96 to Rs. 8.35. During the year under review, your Company's contribution to the national exchequer in the shape of excise duties and sales tax rose to Rs.. 8.669 Billion as compared to Rs. 7.657 Billion in the previous year. The component of excise duties and sales tax paid during the year was equivalent to 62.20% of domestic sales turnover for cigarettes.

LEAF TOBACCO

The 1998 tobacco crop was adequate to meet industry's requirement and that of the Company. Your Company was able to procure the required quantity at competitive prices.

FUTURE OUTLOOK

Your Company will seek to consolidate its position in the face of challenges and current difficult economic situation and will strive to further improve its quality, volume and profitability. Effective cost control measures will be continued with increasing emphasis and expansion of distribution coverage will receive full focus in the ensuing year. Your Company will continue to invest to gear itself to meet future challenges and market opportunities.

The growing availability in the country of smuggled and counterfeited brands across many product categories including cigarettes, negatively impacts both the operations of legitimate manufacturers of these products and the amount of duties and taxes collected by the Government. The Company looks forward to more stringent government action to curtail these activities.

The government is expected to remove the discrimination in the dual excise systems, one prevailing for the larger cigarette manufacturing companies and the other for the so called smaller units. As cigarette manufacturing in Pakistan is not a cottage industry, we have recommended that all cigarette manufacturing units must be placed under a uniform excise system.

It will be your Company's endeavour to manage its resources as best as possible, however, the recently imposed L/C margin on the import of industrial raw materials and machinery will likely put a severe strain on the Company's cash flows. We are recommending that a relief from these impositions be allowed as soon as possible.

An underage smoking prevention programme has been initiated in association with other participants in the cigarette industry. Through this campaign we hope to reinforce the message that smoking is an adult informed choice.

BOARD OF DIRECTORS

On September 27, 1999 ten Directors were elected at the EOGM for a period of 3 years ending September 26, 2002. We welcome Mr. Shahid Ahmed Khan and Mr. Mansoor Ahmed who have recently joined the Board as Directors.

ENSURING YEAR 2000 (Y2K) COMPLIANCE

The management of your Company are fully aware of the Y2K issue. All the core computer systems operating in the Company have been tested and where required, new software and hardware have been obtained to ensure full year 2000 compliance. In addition, your Company has worked with key suppliers to address year 2000 compliance issues, and where appropriate has adopted contingency plans to minimize potential disruptions relating

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to these suppliers.

APPRECIATION

The Directors wish to place on record their appreciation for the sincere and dedicated services rendered by all employees, at all levels, and for the constructive co-operation extended by them in ensuring the high levels of performance and growth that your Company has achieved during the year. The Board of Directors also thank, the banks and financial institutions for the continued support and co-operation extended to your Company during the year under report.

Notes to the Accounts FOR THE YEAR ENDED JUNE 30, 1999

1. NATURE AND STATUS OF BUSINESS

The company was incorporated in Pakistan on February 10, 1969 as a public limited company and its shares are quoted on the Karachi and Lahore stock exchanges. The principal activity of the company is the manufacture and sale of cigarettes and tobacco.

2. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

2.1 Basis of accounting

These accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention except to the extent that certain tangible fixed assets have been included at revalued amounts.

2.2 Tangible fixed assets

These are stated at cost or revaluation less accumulated depreciation except freehold land and capital work in progress which are stated at revalued amount and historical cost respectively.

Depreciation is charged using revalued/historical cost applying the reducing balance method at the rates specified in the fixed assets note.

The cost of leasehold land acquired in April, 1983 on lease of twenty five years is being amortized over the lease period.

Full year's depreciation is charged on additions during the year, whereas, no depreciation is charged on the assets disposed off or retired during the year.

Maintenance and normal repairs are charged to income as and when incurred while major improvements, if any, are capitalised.

Gains and losses on disposal of assets are included in the profit and loss account.

2.3 Accounting for leases

The company accounts for plant and machinery and equipment obtained under financial leases by recording the asset and related liability.

The amounts are determined on the basis of discounted value of total minimum lease payments and residual value of the assets at the end of the lease period to be paid by the

company.

Financial charges are allocated to accounting periods in a manner so as to provide a constant periodic rate of charge on the outstanding liability.

Depreciation is charged at rates used for similar assets, so as to write off the assets over its estimated useful life in view of certainty of the ownership of the assets at the end of the lease term.

Income arising from sale and lease back transactions is deferred and is amortised equally over the lease period.

Lease rentals payable on assets held under operating leases are charged in arriving at operating profits.

2.4 Stores and spares

These are valued at moving average cost except for items in transit which are stated at invoice values plus other charges paid thereon.

2.5 Stock in trade

These are stated at the lower of average cost and net realisable value.

Average cost of raw material includes procurement expenses except raw material in bonded warehouse and in transit which are stated at invoice values plus other charges paid thereon.

Average cost of redried tobacco includes procurement expenses and proportionate overheads incurred on redrying of tobacco leaf.

Average cost in relation to finished goods and work in process includes proportionate production overheads.

Net realisable value represents estimated selling prices in the ordinary course of business less cost necessarily to be incurred to make the sale.

2.6 Foreign Currency Translation

Assets and liabilities in foreign currencies except those covered under forward contracts of exchange have been translated into rupees at the exchange rates prevailing at the balance sheet date.

2.7 Taxation

Provision for current taxation is the higher of the amount computed on taxable income at the current tax rates after taking into account tax rebates on export and minimum tax computed at the prescribed rate on sales net of sales tax and excise duty.

The company accounts for deferred taxation on all material timing differences. The amount is computed using the liability method.

2.8 Staff retirement benefits

The company operates a provident fund scheme effective from October 1, 1975. Accordingly gratuity is not obligatory on the company. Gratuity payable to staff employed prior to introduction of provident fund scheme is accounted for as and when paid and no provision is made for gratuity liability to such continuing staff as the amounts are not material.

2.9 Revenue recognition

Sales are recorded on despatch of goods to customers. Royalty income is accounted for as and when received and interest income is accounted for on accrual basis.

3.3 The company revalued its land, buildings and certain items of plant and machinery in 1978, 1980 and 1984. These revaluations resulted in net surplus of Rs. 17.0 million, Rs. 16.0 million and Rs. 30.0 million respectively. Revalued assets having revaluation surplus of Rs. 11.9 million have been sold todate. The remaining balance of revaluation surplus amounting to Rs. 51.1 million is included in the carrying value of the respective assets with a corresponding amount appearing as "Surplus on Revaluation of Fixed Assets". Element of this revaluation increment included in the book value of these assets as stated in Note. 3.1 amounted to Rs. 19.6 million (1998: Rs. 20.3 million).

3.4 The Company's cigarette factories at Kotri and at Mardan are not operating since June 1988 and July 1991 respectively and Redrying factory at Jehangira has not operating since January 1997. Accordingly, depreciation aggregating to Rs. 14.3 million (1998: Rs. 13.2 million) including Rs. 1.1 million for the current year has not been charged in these accounts. The net book value of fixed assets remaining idle at June 30, 1999 amounted to Rs. 23.5 million (1998: Rs. 25.1 million).

21.1 Contingencies

- a) The Deputy Collector Central Excise and Sales Tax had issued show cause notices on various dates alleging short payment of tobacco excise duty by the Company amounting to Rs. 46.4 million (1998: Rs. 46.4 million) on unmanufactured tobacco consumed for manufacturing of cigarettes. The Company maintains that the actual tobacco excise duty which was assessed by the excise officials prior to entry of the tobacco into the Company's warehouse has been paid by it and there have been no violations of the provisions of the Central Excise Act, 1944. Pending outcome of the case and because Management is confident that the above show cause notices will be withdrawn, no provision has been made in these accounts for the aforesaid amount.
- b) The Sales Tax authorities raised a demand for tax of Rs. 2.9 million alongwith additional tax of Rs. 3.5 million and penalty of Rs. 1.0 million against alleged nonpayment of sales tax for the period December, 1990 to September, 1991 by the Company in respect of raw material cleared at Mandra factory. The Company contested the levy of additional tax and penalty and have been successful in getting waiver of the penalty. The Company has been forced to pay the additional tax although a Constitutional Petition before the Honorable High Court of Sindh has been filed. No provision has been made in these accounts for the charge that would arise in the event of an adverse decision as the Management is confident that the case would be decided in the Company's favour particularly as the taxes were paid voluntarily prior to the additional tax levy by the Sales Tax Authorities.
- c) During the year, the Deputy Commissioner of Income Tax (DCIT) has issued show cause notices to the Company in respect of the assessment years 1995-96 to 1997-98. In these notices the DCIT has expressed his intention to reopen the assessment for these years and make add back of certain expenses which had been allowed in the original assessment orders. The estimated liabilities as a result of these add backs would amount to Rs. 55.6 million. The management is of the view that these show cause notices have been issued without any basis and is confident that no additional liability will accrue to the Company. Consequently no provision have been made in these accounts in respect of the aforementioned amount.

d) Guarantees

There is contingent liability in respect of indemnities given to banks and insurance companies for guarantees issued by them in the normal course of business aggregating to Rs. 486.6 million (1998:Rs.67.7 million).
