FOREWORD

The "district" in Pakistan is the basic unit of administration and the focal point of all social, cultural, economic, administrative and developmental activities. This administrative reality was made the key-note of the publication programme of the 1960 Housing Census and 1961 Population Census. Accordingly, a separate report for each of the 62 Districts and 6 Agencies was included in that programme. The idea originated in June 1960 with my predecessor in office Mr. R. D. Howe, MBE, SQA, CSP, ably supported by his Deputy Mr. N. Shamsi. As initially conceived the District Census Report was to have been in 8 parts, namely:—

- Part I .. Geography and brief history of the administrative district.
- Part II .. General Information.
- Part III .. Housing and Household Statistics.
- Part IV .. Vital Statistics.
- Part V .. Cottage Industries.
- Part VI .. Population Statistics
- Part VII .. Village Lists.
- Part VIII .. Maps.

It was intended that the Village List should also include the complete location code number of every village and a fairly complete description of each block. Part VIII—Maps—was intended to include, besides the maps of the district, all urban area maps which have been collected and made up-to-date during the census operations. Recognizing that it was a very big task, Mr. Howe, while asking for the views of the Provincial Directors of Census, frankly said: "Admittedly, it is an ambitious project, but in my opinion the

labour involved will not be out of all proportion to the tremendous value of the end product."

The first reaction of the Provincial Directors was not favourable. They thought that the Zonal Officers did not have the time and necessary background to do justice to Part I—'Geography and brief history of the administrative district'. Meanwhile, Mr. S.M. Ikram, C.S.P. Member, Board of Revenue, West Pakistan, got interested in the District Census Reports and he hoped that "in spite of obvious difficulties the Distt. Census Reports should be enlarged and converted into handy and business-like District Decennial Gazetteers". Mr. Ikram's idea was pursued for some time but when it was found that the rewriting of Gazetteers involved far greater efforts outlay and much longer time than Census could afford, the Census Organisation reverted to the original plan of a brief narrative for Part I.

It was planned that the Zonal Census Officers would write short notes on the history, geography and a few administrative activities of the district after the Big Count was over in 1961. The Zonal Census Officers were actually busy in the field collecting the preliminary reports and consolidating them for inclusion in the provisional census results of Pakistan till the end of February, 1961. The work on the writing of the descriptive part was not therefore started until the middle of March 1961. I took over from Mr. Howe in the beginning of March 1961 and, although, initially, like Mr. Aslam Abdullah Khan, Provincial Director of Census, West Pakistan, I was myself hesitating from a sense of inadequacy to undertake such a big project, it did not take me long to be

convinced about the tremendous value of presenting the district in all its aspects in a handy volume for the use of planners, administrators and the general public. After much consideration and consultation the scope of the Reports (except for the Agencies) was narrowed down to the following five parts only—

Part I	..	General Description.
Part II	..	General Tables.
Part III	..	Housing Tables.
Part IV	..	Population Tables
Part V	..	Village Statistics.

For various administrative reasons the reports for Agencies will be much shorter without the Housing Tables and Village Statistics but they will contain information about different Tribes and their social and economic life.

It was actually Part I, General Description, which called for the greatest amount of labour, research and co-ordination by the Census Officers at various levels. As stated earlier, there were some views that this part should have been more or less an up-to-date version of the encyclopaedic District Gazetteer. As against it there were advocates in the Census Organization of cutting it to the bare bones and present only a short description of the geography, natural resources and the administrative system of the district. I found it necessary to strike a middle course between these two extreme views and after much consideration the "General Description" was planned to contain the following chapters—

Chapter I	..	History, Geography and Administration.
Chapter II	..	People and Their Environments.
Chapter III	..	Important Places.
Chapter IV	..	District Headquarter Town.

I must admit that the inclusion of the last three

chapters is my idea as I felt that this would constitute a special contribution of the Census Officers to the total information about the districts. Population Census is admittedly the most comprehensive national stock-taking that a country embarks upon from time to time. The main object of census is no doubt taking an accurate count of the people according to their various demographic and social characteristics. In the process of census taking, however, a mass of related and ancillary information is collected, directly or indirectly, by the census-taker. The 'Census Officer', to use the generic term, applied to all those who were appointed to take the census, travelled widely and observed closely all manner of men and lands, thereby gaining valuable knowledge of the physical features, agriculture, industry, public health, communications, housing and above all of the way of life and cultural pattern of the people. I had no doubt in my mind that these officers could pool their knowledge and write out a short account of the people and their environments, the important places they saw and the district headquarter town in which they worked with great deal of confidence and accuracy. Despite various limitations, particularly lack of reference material and shortage of time, the Zonal Census Officers wrote out the draft Reports in time.

The Part I—General Description—of these Reports is essentially a compilation rather than a fully original writing. The very nature of the assignment left hardly any choice but to make the well-documented and authoritative District Gazetteers the main source of this compilation. The sections on physical features, geography, geology, climate, river and mountain systems, flora, fauna, history are largely adaptations from the relevant District Gazetteers. These have, of course, been modified, revised and enlarged wherever necessary to make the information up-to-date and factual. The Zonal Officers also toured

the districts extensively and consulted revenue and executive officers as well as well-informed local people about facts and statistics given in every section. The sections on Agriculture, Irrigation, Communication, Industry, Administration, Medical and Health, Education and Land Reforms are mostly original writings but do not fail to include relevant information from District Gazetteers not rendered obsolete by passage of time. The section on the Basic Democracies is an entirely new feature giving a brief pen-picture of the revolutionary concept of national and local administration as working in practice. The reports drafted by the Zonal Officers were sent to the respective Deputy Commissioners for scrutiny and comments. The object of routing the reports through the Deputy Commissioners was to ensure the accuracy and completeness of the facts and figures. The Deputy Commissioners, busy as they were with their multifarious co-ordinating and developmental activities, found time not only to check the drafts but in almost all cases also to add their personal contributions in several sections, thereby making definite improvements in the text.

The chapter on "The People and their Environments" is an attempt at a sociological and demographic study of the district. This was added in September 1961 when the Zonal Officers had already left the scene. As no specific instruction was given to the Zonal Officers earlier in this regard, their treatment of the demographic features was casual and incidental. The Deputy Commissioners were, therefore, asked to rewrite the sections on races and tribes, dress, dwelling houses, food and health, betrothals and marriages, births and deaths, religion, customs and usages, main and subsidiary occupations, and cultural pattern of the people. In these sections the District Gazetteers again played an important part but from their intimate knowledge of the district the Deputy

Commissioners and their Revenue Assistants threw new and interesting light on the life and activity of its people. In several districts these sections have been entirely re-written.

The chapter on the "District Head-quarter Town" was added much later and the help of the Assistant Directors of Census in charge of and Sorting Centres was very much welcomed at that stage for writing a brief account of these towns. This chapter is, in fact, an original contribution of the Census Officers.

It was not found administratively feasible to include in these Reports all the maps that the Census Organisation had collected during the census operations. I quite realise that the inclusion of urban area maps would have enriched these volumes but due to the overriding considerations of economy and time these had to be left out. Maps are, however, an integral part of any report that claims to present a comprehensive picture of the district and keeping this point in view two maps of the district have been included in these Reports. One of the maps is in colour showing the district by sub-divisions/Tehsils and such details as railways, roads, canals, rivers, hills and mountains, district, sub-division and Thana headquarters and important places. The other map is in black and white showing the industrial establishments and agricultural products of the district in symbols and letters. There is one feature in the District Census Reports which, to our knowledge, has not been included in any previous census or gazetteer publications. I refer to the photographs of the people and the land in which they live and work. Simultaneously with my request to the Deputy Commissioners for the report on the "People and Their Environments", they were asked to take suitable photographs of the people, young and old, their activities in the field and at home, the typical landscapes and the places of historical importance and of scenic beauty.

The photographs thus collected are in themselves a storehouse of information and provide ample material for a general study of demographic and economic characteristics of the country. For lack of space, we have been able to reproduce only a part of the photographs but we hope they are fairly representative of the people and their surroundings.

All the officers engaged in the original drafting of the various sections and chapters of Part I "General Description" of these reports gave commendable performance. It is no reflection on the merit of their work that despite their sincere and wholehearted work these drafts had to be thoroughly edited at the level of the Provincial Directors and Census Commissioner. The Provincial Directors have in their 'Introduction' related their experience in revising, enlarging or condensing, adjusting and checking the wealth of information already supplied in these draft reports. While doing so, they undertook extensive tours of the districts and brought their knowledge and experience to bear upon the final shape of the information given. I also felt it necessary to take extensive tours in the different sectors of our big and widely separated country and made demographic and economic investigation into representative facts. The District Census Reports of West Pakistan came under the thorough scrutiny of Mr. Aslam Abdullah Khan, Provincial Director of Census, while I gave only general editorial guidance. So far as East Pakistan Reports are concerned, I am glad to take the responsibility of large scale editing of the various chapters and sections. I was emboldened to do so by the fact of my association with the district, and sub-divisional administration of that Province for nearly a quarter of a century and also by the knowledge I had acquired during my extensive tours of every single Census District of the Province in the year 1960 in connection with the organiza-

tion of the census.

For a small census organisation consisting of barely half a dozen officers at the top, publication of a District Census Report for each of the sixty-two districts and six agencies is undoubtedly a huge undertaking. We are painfully conscious of our shortcomings and limitations. None of my colleagues who produced the General Description of the Report claim to be a scholar "with a flair for penmanship"—a quality which Mr. Ikram desired in a writer of gazetteers—yet all of them took up the challenge cheerfully and did their very best to complete the job once undertaken. Ours is a modest effort which by no stretch of imagination can replace the excellent gazetteers. We were at one stage tempted to call Part I of the Report—a Brief Gazetteer—but we saw the peril in time and named it—General Description—which it really is. I would request the readers not to look for the details or merits of a gazetteer in these volumes but I do hope that until gazetteers are extensively rewritten, these will be found useful as up-to-date reference materials.

Mr. Aslam Abdullah Khan shook off his initial hesitation and in spite of his full-time occupation as Secretary, Basic Democracies, West Pakistan, thoroughly revised the descriptive portions of the Reports. In particular, his intimate knowledge of the Frontier areas and the districts of Quetta and Peshawar Divisions has enriched the reports of these districts. Mr. H. H. Nomani, M.A., S.K., who has varied experience of the district administration of East Pakistan as District Magistrate and Deputy Commissioner has also taken pains to go through the reports closely and given his valuable suggestions for their improvement. Mr. Aslam Abdullah Khan and Mr. H. H. Nomani stood solidly by me at all times of stress and strain and I am deeply grateful to them for their valuable help.

I must also place on record my deep appreciation of the energetic, intelligent and painstaking editing of all the District Census Reports of East Pakistan by Mr. Bahauddin Ahmed, Joint Director of Census, East Pakistan. He brought to bear in his writing and compilation a sharp insight and wide research into the history, geography and lives of the people of the districts. Mr. Sheikh Muhammad Sharif, Deputy Director of Census, Headquarter, West Pakistan, did an equally good job in the preliminary editing of these reports and in helping his Director by collecting reference material. I have also great pleasure in thanking Messrs P. A. Nazir, CSP, K.M.A. Samdani, CSP, A. Majid, PCS, B. Ahmed, EPCS, B. Alam, EPCS, Ghulam Husain, and A. K. Chowdhury, EPC, Zonal Census Officers who laid the foundation of this unpretentious but laborious work of census reporting. As Karachi did not form part of the West Pakistan Province until some time after the conclusion of enumeration the descriptive part of the Karachi report was compiled independently by Mr. Agha Mustafa Qasim Qizilbash, Deputy Director of Census, Karachi. He undertook a very laborious research in order to collect accurate and up-to-date information about the various aspects of Karachi life. His task was rendered all the more difficult by the fact that no separate gazetteer for Karachi as such had been written ever before. He continued to display devoted enthusiasm and gave much material help for this report even after his reversion to his parent department. I must thank him for his deep devotion to duty and his unfailing co-operation. I also highly appreciate the services of Mr. Mohammed Hafiz Shaikh, Officer on Special Duty, Census, who gave me material support in recasting and editing this report.

Mr. Ruhul Amin, Deputy Director of Machine Sorting Centre, Dacca, and Mr.

W.A. Abbasi, Assistant Director of Machine Sorting Centre, Karachi, showed a high degree of technical skill and organizing ability in producing the Housing Census Tables with such a mass of details. I highly value their contribution to the success of the District Census Reports and extend to them my heartiest thanks. Messrs Akhlaque Hosain Kazi and Jalaluddin Ahmed Chowdhury, Assistant Directors of Compilation Centres, Lahore and Dacca, played a similarly important role in giving the final shape to the Population Tables. Part IV of this report bears ample testimony to their ability and hard work. The Statistical Officers Mr. Haq Nawaz Shaikh at Lahore, and Mr. Riaz-ud-Din at Dacca also made substantial contribution to the accuracy of the Population Tables and Village Statistics by their steady, painstaking and intelligent statistical work. The Assistant Directors of Hand Sorting Centres who compiled the report for the district towns deserve my special thanks as they were asked to do something which was beyond the normal call of their duty and they did it without the slightest murmur. My special and grateful thanks are due to Colonel E. H. Slade, MBE, MC, FIS, who had been with the Census Organisation as Census Adviser till May, 1962, for his ungrudging help in planning the final get-up of the District Census Reports. I feel at a loss to think what I would have done without his active guidance in the preparation of the coloured and black and white district maps as well as in selecting the proper symbols for the local details included in the Village Statistics. Besides being a distinguished statistician, he was also an artist-cartographer. He drew out the master copies of the maps with his own hand and wrote out the instructions for their printing. He had to leave us before the Reports came out in print but I hope he will be satisfied with the result. We are immeasurably indebted to him for his wise

counsel and help. I am also thankful to his successor, Mr. Lowell T. Galt, head of the United States Statistical Advisory Service to Pakistan, for his keen personal interests in these reports and his encouraging comments and suggestions.

I have no words to adequately thank the officers and staff of the Central and Provincial Governments, various Ministries and Departments, the districts and sub-divisional officers and a host of other public-spirited men and women of our country who gave unstinted support, help and encouragement in the planning, preparation and publication of these Reports. In particular, I gratefully acknowledge the substantial help that the Chief Secretaries of the two Provincial Governments gave us by agreeing to let us have the photographs of the districts through their official photographers free of cost and by letting the District Officers write out the chapter on the "People and Their Environments." I am particularly happy to record that all the District Officers, in many cases assisted by their Revenue Assistants and Additional District Magistrates, enthusiastically took up this additional and unscheduled responsibility. The Secretaries, Information Departments and the Directors of Information of both the Provincial Governments rendered invaluable service in the matter of obtaining suitable photographs from far-flung corners of the districts. The Directors of Land Records

and Surveys made our task easier by supplying up-to-date roads and places maps of the districts as well as area figures. The Surveyor-General of Pakistan has been equally generous with the supply of topographical and administrative maps. I also acknowledge with great pleasure our indebtedness to various newspaper articles, learned societies, journals, periodicals, university professors, social scientists, geographers and historians for the valuable information we collected from them for inclusion in the reports. I would also like to thank Mr. N. H. Khandker, Controller of Printing and Stationery, and Mr. Qasim Ali, Deputy Controller of Printing and Stationery, and the various printing presses, particularly the Ilmi Press, Lahore, for their technical know-how, unhesitating advice and prompt service at all stages of the printing of these Reports. Lastly, I must thank the staff of the Census Organisations in the Centre and the Provinces who worked untiringly to edit, check and verify these Reports statistically and aesthetically. The Statistical Section of my Office did a fine job in this regard and were ably assisted by a very good team of Draftsmen who produced the cover plates and the maps inside. In particular, I am grateful to Messrs Safdar Husain and A. Sattar, Statistical Officers and Messrs Hasan Akhtar and Din Mohammed, Investigators, for careful and painstaking checking of the narrative portions of all the districts.

INTRODUCTION

The District Census Report of Multan District is one of the 51 similar reports being published separately for each District and Agency of West Pakistan.

In the last Census, the statistical results of the Census were published in various Provincial and Central Reports. Thus there were separate reports for the North-West Frontier Province, the Punjab and Bahawalpur, Sind & Khairpur and Baluchistan Provinces. These reports did not provide data in a handy volume separately for smaller geographical and administrative units namely; the districts with the result that the district statistics which were collected at much labour and expense were lost in the statistical totals for larger areas for the Province as a whole.

The integration of the former Provinces and States into the unified Province of West Pakistan has further underlined the need for statistics on district basis, as the individual identity of districts tends to get lost in the statistical totals contained in the Provincial Statistical Report. Further, the growing importance of developmental activities undertaken by Government for smaller administrative and geographical areas has made it imperative that data in much greater detail for districts should be made available to the administrators, planners and experts for the purpose of planning and development. The Provincial and All-Pakistan Reports do not meet this requirement to the desired extent.

The "Village Lists" published for the first time in 1951 provided limited information for all villages in each district giving the total population, the number of houses and other local details. These volumes proved very

useful for the Government Departments and non-official bodies and individual users.

The District Census Report now being brought out is a more ambitious project and attempts to present the statistical data for the district which is often dull and lifeless against the living background of its geography, history and its people. It is hoped that this volume will acquaint the reader with the district as a geographic, administrative and human entity, against which its statistics will acquire a new meaning and help present the district in all its aspects.

This report is in five parts, namely—Part I—General Description, Part II—General Tables, Part III—Housing Tables, Part IV—Population Tables compiled from the Population Census, 1961, and Part V—Village Statistics.

In Part I, an attempt has been made to give a general picture of the district on the lines of the old District Gazetteers, though within a much shorter compass incorporating the changes which have taken place since the time the Gazetteers were last published. The General Description includes brief paragraphs on geography and geology, flora and fauna, climate, brief history, administrative set-up, Health, Education, Communications, Basic Democracies, Agriculture and Industries, Land Reforms, the population and its composition, ethnological and demographical features, cultural pattern of the people, important places of interest, etc. It also contains a brief description of the district headquarters city. Besides, this Part also contains maps and pictures which have been provided to enable the reader to have a clearer perspective of the district and its people.

Part II includes tables giving general information provided by sources other than Census. Inclusion of this Part was considered necessary in order to bring within one volume some general statistical information which, like the Census data, is commonly required by planners and administrators. The general information tables include data on Rainfall, Temperature, Irrigation, Industries, Dak Bungalows, Educational Institutions, Hospitals, Roads, Basic Democracies, etc. These tables were collected from the Government Departments at the Provincial Headquarters and other Divisional and District Offices of some Departments. The data supplied by the Departments has been checked only for purposes of editing. While efforts have been made to eliminate all errors, the Census Organization is not responsible for the accuracy of the data presented in these Tables. In some cases data in respect of particular Tables was either not supplied in time or not in the required form. Such tables perforce have had to be omitted from this volume. My thanks are due to the Heads of various Departments and Offices for their ungrudging and prompt response. All these tables were carefully scrutinized by Mr. Haq Nawaz, Statistical Officer of my office, and gone over by Mr. S. M. Sharif, Deputy Director, before they were incorporated in this Report.

The Housing Tables which form Part III of this Report were entirely processed in the Machine Sorting Centre, Karachi. They were compiled and tabulated by mechanical operation on cent per cent basis for all urban areas, and on a 10 per cent sample basis in the case of rural areas. The Housing Tables provide invaluable information about the housing conditions in both urban and rural areas, the number of occupied and unoccupied houses, congested houses, size and structural characteristics of the housing units, size of

family and the size of households, etc. All this work was done in the Machine Sorting Centre at Karachi under the able direction of Mr. W. A. Abbasi, Assistant Director, Machine Sorting Centre, to whom my thanks are due for furnishing this part of the Report.

Part IV contains the Population Tables which are based on data collected during the Big Count in January, 1961. These Tables provide data about population for smaller administrative areas down to Tehsils by sex and religion, urban and rural population, the composition of the population by age, sex and marital status, literacy and by mother tongue, birth-place and main economic activities. It may be noted that detailed cross-classification of the Non-Agricultural Labour Force by occupations and industry has been left to be done by machine-sorting and the results will be published separately in a set of tables especially designed for the purpose. The Population Tables have been extracted from the Provincial Tables pertaining to this District. They are based on the data collected on the Individual Census Schedules by a large army of Census field workers, viz., the Enumerators, Supervisors, Charge Superintendents, District Census Officers and Zonal, Deputy/Assistant Directors. The names of some officers of each category are given elsewhere in this Report. In the District of Multan the Census was taken by 4,950 Enumerators, 691 Supervisors, 87 Charge Superintendents and 5 District Census Officers. After the field work was over, records were sent by the District Census Officers to the Hand Sorting Centre, Multan, which worked under the able guidance and control of Mr. A. Hamid, Deputy Director of Census, Multan. Here the schedules were unstapled and sorted and re-sorted according to different characteristics, in accordance with Sorting and Compilation instructions, issued from the office of the Census Commissioner, Pakistan. A large

number of Sorters, Supervisors, Inspectors and Compilers worked on this tedious and difficult job under the inspiring leadership of Mr. A. Hamid. After the sorting operations were over the Record Sheets which were prepared for each tabulating region separately, were transferred to the Central Compilation Office at Lahore, where the data was compiled by Mr. Akhlaque Hosain Kazi, Assistant Director of Census (Compilation), West Pakistan. Thus the data contained in Part IV represents the cumulative efforts of a large army of workers, both paid and unpaid, to whom the Census Organization acknowledges a debt of deep gratitude, for without their efforts, there would have been no Census. I wish I could name all of them individually but that would require a volume in itself.

In Part V, a complete list of the villages of the district has been arranged by Tehsils, Qanungo Halqas and Patwar Circles. The Village Statistics give for each village, the Hadbast Number, area, total population by sex, total literates, total number of houses and households. Besides the above, local details showing the location, Schools, Post and Telegraph Offices, Railway Stations, Police Stations, Union Council Offices, Dak Bungalows, Dispensaries and Hospitals, etc., have been shown by appropriate symbols. The Village Statistics were originally compiled in the Hand Sorting Centre, Multan from the summaries prepared by the Census Supervisors and Charge Superintendents. The figures of population were thoroughly checked after physical counting of the individual enumeration schedules at the Circle Sort. The data about houses and households are based on the summaries prepared by the Charge Superintendents on the results of Housing Census conducted in September, 1960. These figures were checked and adjusted, where necessary, with reference to the results of the Machine tabulation done in

Census Commissioner's Office, Karachi. The literacy figures have been taken from the summaries prepared by the Census Supervisors and Charge Superintendents after the "Big Count". The particulars of "Hadbast" numbers, and local details were obtained from the Deputy Commissioner. The area figures have been supplied by the Deputy Commissioner, Multan, and are based on revenue records. The Village Statistics were thoroughly scrutinised by the Statistical Officer in my office before incorporation in this Report.

The data presented have been arranged by Tehsils and in each Tehsil the Villages have been grouped by Field Qanungo Circles and within each Field Qanungo Circle by Patwari Circles. A summary giving the total population of the district with its distribution by sexes to the nearest thousand by Tehsils and number of Qanungo Halqas, Patwari Circles and Villages has been given at the beginning. Similar summaries by Field Qanungo Circles within each Tehsil indicating separately figures of urban localities have also been added.

Part I—General Description was compiled by Mr. A. Hamid, Deputy Director of Census, Multan. In preparing this Part he made extensive use of the District Gazetteer of Multan and various other published materials. The draft was seen by Sh. Muhammad Sharif, Deputy Director of Census, West Pakistan, who added several useful suggestions. The Census Commissioner was kind enough to spare enough time to edit this part of the Report and I am grateful to him for his guidance, inspiration and help in giving a final shape to it. In its present form and content this Part is the result of the cumulative efforts of Mr. S. M. Sharif and myself, besides S. Sajjad Hussain Shah, my Stenographer, who typed several drafts of it. I am, therefore, grateful to them for all their efforts.

The maps appearing in this volume were drawn in the Statistical Section of my office by Mr. Muhammad Saleem, Draftsman, under the close supervision and guidance of Mr. Haq Nawaz, Statistical Officer, and of Sh. Muhammad Sharif, Deputy Director. I am grateful to them for the hard work they have put in for the preparation of these maps. My thanks are also due to Sh. Niaz Ahmad of the Ilmi Press, Lahore, where these reports have been printed from the "master copies" prepared in my office, through the photo-offset process.

The photographs which appear in this volume have been obtained by the courtesy of the Director of Public Relations, West Pakistan, Mr. Jameel-uz-Zaman, his staff and the Deputy Commissioner, Multan, to whom we are highly indebted.

I must express my gratitude to Malik Karam Dad Khan, then Deputy Commissioner, Multan, all Heads of Departments of the Government of West Pakistan, Malik Sikander Khan, P. C. S., Revenue Assistant, and all subordinate revenue staff, who have rendered invaluable services in the collection and compilation of the Village Statistics and other data presented in this volume.

I must also record my appreciation for the hard work put in by the Sh. Muhammad Sharif, Deputy Director of Census, West Pakistan, Mr. A. Hamid, Deputy Director

of Census, Hand Sorting Centre, Multan, and Mr. Haq Nawaz, Statistical Officer and the staff in my own office who have given unremitting pains in completing this volume for publication. It is hoped that this volume will be of benefit to the various Departments of Government and will also be useful as a reference material.

My thanks are also due to Mr. Lowell T. Galt, Statistical Adviser to the Government of Pakistan and Dr. James Maslowski, Adviser, Planning and Development Department, Government of West Pakistan, who were kind enough to visit the Compilation Centre and offer valuable advice and guidance at the crucial stages in which the data took the shape of comprehensible tables.

The idea of publishing comprehensive statistics for districts collected in the 1961 Census had its beginnings in the Village List of 1951. The proposal was first made by Mr. R. D. Howe, in February 1961. The idea was doggedly pursued and developed by Mr. A Rashid, his successor, and the format, lay-out and plan of the present volume is due entirely to his vision, planning and perseverance in getting this project translated from a mere idea into reality. I must confess that I faltered and hesitated at many stages in completing this assignment as being too ambitious for Census, but his unflagging interest and inspiration made the publication of this volume in its present shape possible.

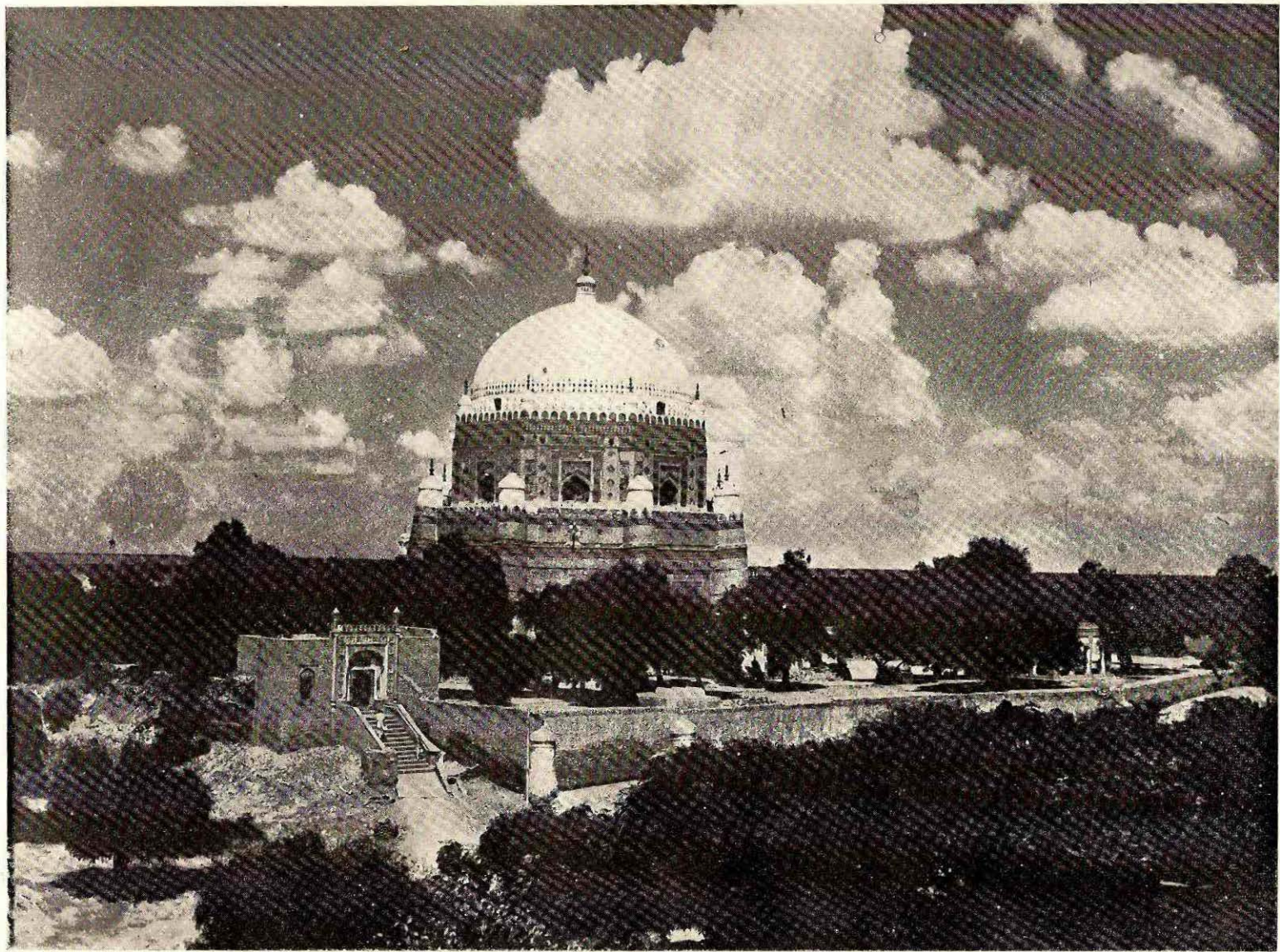

CHAPTER 1

GEOGRAPHY, HISTORY AND ADMINISTRATION

1.1 NAME.

The origin of the name Multan is obscure. Hiuen Tsang who visited it in 641 A.D. calls it Mu-lo-san Pu-lu. Alberuni quoting a Kashmiri author calls it Multana. According to another source the early name of the town was Multarang or Multaran. It has been called by different names at different times. In the time of Narsing Bhagwan, its name was "Kashep Puri". Later on it came to be known as "Parlhad Puri" and then as "Bhag Pura" and "Samb Pura". In the time of Bhagwan Krishan, the Hindu hero and diety, the town acquired the name of "Mitroon" and later on "Maheelastan" which in course of time became Multan.

1.2 LOCATION.

Multan district lies between north latitude $29^{\circ} 22'$ and $30^{\circ} 45'$ and east longitude $71^{\circ} 4'$ and $72^{\circ} 55'$.

1.3 BOUNDARIES.

It lies in a bend made by five confluent rivers. It is bounded on the east, north and west by the districts of Montgomery, Jhang and Muzaffargarh respectively, and on the south by Bahawalpur, and roughly speaking the Sutlej separates it from Bahawalpur and the Chenab from Muzaffargarh, but in the case of Jhang and Montgomery, the boundary is an artificial one. The district as now constituted forms a rough triangle with the Montgomery line forming its base and the point of junction of the Chenab and Sutlej its apex. The length of the base is about sixty miles, that of the Chenab line 100 miles and that of the Sutlej 120 to 130 miles.

1.4 AREA.

The total area of the district is, 5,6 square miles. Its position in respect of area is 17th in Pakistan and 16th in West Pakistan.

1.5 PHYSICAL FEATURES AND TOPOGRAPHY

The three natural divisions of the district are the riverain or *Hithar*, the high barren areas or *Rawa* and the lands intermediate between them known as *Utar*. The distinctive features of the riverain area are the high water-level and the influence of river floods. The outstanding features of the *Rawa* is low-water level. Differences of soil between the two areas are negligible, and there is a remarkable uniformity of physical conditions. The typically riverain area is relatively small. The Chenab carries larger floods than both the Sutlej and the Ravi owing to the presence of natural creeks and artificial channels, the influence of which extends over a large area especially in the Shujabad tehsil, where part of the country are flooded in years of heavy rain-fall. To the north of Shujabad tehsil and along the greater part of the riverain boundary of Multan tehsil, bunds are necessary to protect the adjacent canal-irrigated land from damage. Cultivation in the riverain depends on the nature of the floods and varies considerably from year to year and from village to village. The deposits of the three rivers possess different qualities. The golden silt of the Ravi is the best, that of the Sutlej often does as much harm as good, while that of the Chenab is generally of benefit though inferior to that of the Ravi.

1.6 SOIL.

The soil of the district is of alluvial character and sand is everywhere met with a few feet below the surface. Detailed geological study of the district has not been carried out, but a useful sketch may be found in the records of Geographical studies.

1.7 GEOLOGY.

The district is destitute of mineral wealth. Saltpetre is manufactured on a small scale and a little *kankar* is found here and there on the surface.

1.8 FLORA.

The principal trees of the district are the *Jand* (*Prosopis Spicigera*), *Karril* (*Capparis aphylla*), *Farash* (*Tamarix articulata*), *Kikar* (*Acacia arbica*), *Shisham* (*Dalbergia Sissoo*), *Ber* (*Zizyphus jujaba*), *Tut Bohar* (*Fucus indica*), *Sirin* (*Albizzia lebbek*), *Amb* (*Mangifera indica*) and *Nim* (*Melia indica*), *Piple* (*Ficus religiosa*), *Khajji* (*Phaenix doctylifera*) and *Bhan* (*Populus euphratica*). The first four are found all over the *Bar* and flourish in the dry arid tracts, the others require a moist soil and are found on moist or irrigated soils. Out of these *Kikar* is the most useful to the agriculturist, as its wood is used for beams for roofs, carts, water-lifts and ploughs etc. Irrigated plantations have been introduced after the advent of canal irrigation in the district.

1.9 FAUNA.

In the Mailsi tehsil, grey partridges are fairly common, and black partridges are found occasionally in the *Hithar*, there are no duck or snipe nor any *nilgai* or black buck. The only deer to be met with is the Chinkara and the hog deer. Wild boar are also found particularly in the riverain areas. Sand-grouse visit the district during the winter. Quail, plover, and pigeons are fairly common. Foxes, hares and jackals are met with everywhere.

1.10 RIVERS AND NALLAS.

The whole of the tract is an alluvial plain sloping gently from the north-east to the south-west with a slight slope also from north-west to the south-east. It is all of comparatively recent formation. The physical history of the district is in fact the history of its rivers, which have made up the formation. The Ravi had different courses in the past. The Sidhnai reach (*i.e.* the straight river) is perfectly straight cutting some 10 or 12 miles in length from a little south-west of Tulamba to a little east of Serai Sidhu. In the days of Aurangzeb the Ravi flowed past Multan. One of the revenue *mahals* is still known as *taraf* Ravi. A branch of the Ravi (Monan) ran within a mile of the city as late as the 18th century. Even in recent past before the intervention of the Sidhnai cultivation a channel of the Ravi flowed during the floods upto the suburbs of the city. The nature of water in the Ravi during the winter months has much decreased owing to the supplies taken off by the Bari Doab Canal system and for the greater part of winter its bed is dry. When there is water in the river, the whole of it is available for irrigation through the head at Sidhnai. On account of the uncertain supply in the river the Haveli Canal connecting Trimmu with the Sidhnai was constructed diverting the water from Sutlej into the Ravi.

The Chenab is never dry and never even fordable except in exceptionally dry seasons. It is conjectured that at one time the Cheneb flowed east of Multan, but since the 11th century it has flowed to the west of the town as testified by Alberuni. As it now flows the river has no high banks and the difference between the average level of the highest floods is only between 13 to 15 feet. The damage which it used to cause by inundation threatening Multan itself has been stopped by the construction of a series of embankments extending from *Khatti Char* in

the Kabirwala tehsil to Dhundhua in Shujabad tehsil. The Chenab water is more fertilising than the Sutlej, but less than the Ravi. The south-western part of the district receives water from both these rivers and the people here refer to the Sutlej as male and the Chenab as female.

The *Beas* used to run through the centre of the district at one time, but since over two hundred years it joins with the Sutlej at Hari Ka Pattan in the Lahore district. There is a story that the *Beas* deserted its old course because certain boatmen refused to carry a *faqir* across the stream thereby entailing his curse.

The *Sutlej* is also known as *Nili* or *Ghara*. It is believed that the *Sutlej* originally joined with a river known as *Hakra* but has been lost, which used to flow through Bahawalpur some 40 miles south of the *Sutlej*. The river bed of the *Sutlej* is narrower and more sharply defined than that of the *Chenab*. The northern bank is far better defined than that of the *Chenab*. Near the confluence of the two rivers the intervening land is regularly flooded during the summer, but the floods come almost entirely from the *Chenab*, the *Sutlej*, as a rule inundating only the area below the high bank.

Nallas.

Amongst the *Nallas*, the more well-known are the *Nala Wali Muhammad* dug in 1750 A.D. under the orders of Nawab Ali Muhamntad Khan, the then Ruler of Multan; the *Nalla Sikandari*—dug in 1777 A.D. by Nijabat Khan, a landlord; the *Nalla Gujurtarta*—dug in the reign of Nawab Muzaffar Khan in the 19th century; and the *Nalla Bakhtowah*—dug by Bakhto, a landlord of Mauza Toderpur in the reign of Nawab Shuja Khan, the founder of the present town Shujabad.

1.11 CLIMATE AND TEMPERATURE.

The maximum temperature recorded in

summer and winter is 105°F and 73°F respectively. The minimum temperature in winter sometimes touches 49°F. The hottest months are May, June, July and August. The heat and dust of Multan are proverbial. Day temperature in the summer months between March and September is high, but the nights are comparatively cool. The highest day temperature is recorded in the months of May and June. The winter is pleasant; the coldest months being the latter half of December and January.

The maximum and minimum mean of temperature during the various months of summer, winter and springs seasons is indicated below:—

Rainfall. The normal rainfall is about 6" most of which falls during the monsoons—from July to Spetember. Winter rain is very scarce.

1.12 WIND-STORMS.

Wind-storms have been one of the chief characteristics of Multan in olden days. The intensity of the heat and wind-storms as well as the graveyards and beggars of Multan are proverbial. In recent times, however, both the frequency and the intensity of the wind-storms have considerably decreased on account of the extensive development in agriculture in and around the district.

1.13 HISTORY.

The history of Multan prior to the arrival of the Arabs in the 8th century, A. D. is obscure. Alexander is said to have passed through the district in about 325-326 B.C., but

his route cannot be traced and is purely conjectural. After his departure from the district Alexander left Philip as "Satrap" in charge who was murdered shortly afterwards. About 327 B.C. the Macedonians were ousted by Chandragupta and the Maurya dynasty remained in power till the beginning of the second century. From 30 B.C. to 470 A. D. the Khushan dynasty ruled over the area and from 470 to 550 A.D. the White Huns are supposed to have held sway. Multan figures as the capital of an important province of the Kingdom of Sind in the writings of the early Arab geographers. At the time the Arabs first came to Sind, the country was ruled by Raja Chach a Brahman. The Chach-Nama relates that Siharas had divided the Kingdom into four provinces, the most northern of which had its capital at Multan and extended as far as the borders of Kashmir. After seizing Alor, Chach marched upon Multan which was then held (630 A.D.) by Malik Bajhra who capitulated. Chach died in 671 A.D. and was followed by his son Chandar (679 A. D.) and the latter by his nephew Dahir son of Chach. In 641 A.D. the Chinese Pilgrim Hiuen Tsang came via Sind to Multan. The account of his travels merely states that leaving the right bank of the river Indus, he arrived at the Kingdom of Mulosan-Pulu. The conquest of Sind by the Arabs under Muhammad-bin-Qasim paved the way for the march of the Arabs right upto Multan. The occupation of the district by the Arabs was militant in nature with a Governor in Multan and another subordinate Governor in Kehrur. The conquerers were largely Arabs. As time passed and the power of the Caliphate declined, Multan became independent of Baghdad by the end of 9th century. The district remained for three centuries the out-post of Islam in India, while the rest of the Punjab remained under Hindu rulers. The area of Multan remained in the hands of the Karmatian sect for almost two centuries, when they

were overthrown by Daud Lodhi. The country remained nominally subject to the Ghaznavies until they were overthrown by Mohammad Ghauri who in the course of his expeditions passed several times through Multan.

From the beginning of the 13th century for the next three centuries, the history of Multan is practically the history of the incursions from western and central Asia to which the invasion of Changez gave rise. During this period Multan was nominally subject to the Delhi Empire, but during two periods it was practically a separate kingdom independent of Delhi. At times the province was held by powerful Governors who, though unable to secure independence, were powerful factors in the dynastic changes of the time. The administration of Multan suffered due to the pre-occupation of the Delhi Empire in repelling the repeated raids of the Mughals from Khurasan and Central Asia.

In 1397 came the invasion of Taimur, whose troops occupied Uch and Multan, sacked Tulamba, raided the Khokhars of Ravi and passed across Beas to Pakpattan and Delhi. In 1413, Shah Rukh, the grandson of Taimur, despatched a force against the Province, which advanced to the very gates of the city before it was defeated. In 1524-25, the Arghan/Turks occupied and sacked the city. Finally, in 1528, came the peaceful transfer of the Province to the emissaries of Babar. For three centuries, this district bore the brunt of the raids from Central Asia. The difficulties of the Khyber route and the strength of the northern Gakkhars drove the majority of the invaders to attempt the Multan route into the sub-continent. "The Multan district, therefore, which in the ninth and tenth centuries constituted an out-work of western Islam against Eastern paganism, became in the thirteenth and fourteenth centuries the foremost barrier of Islam in India against the Paganism and barbarism

which swept upon it from the West." During this period, the district had no real prosperity. The fact that an important commercial route gave a certain amount of intermittent prosperity to the city, left the greater part, except the strips of alluvial soil along the Chenab and the Sutlej, barren and undeveloped. The effect of the Mughal invasion was to break up and drive away the larger tribes, preventing any systematic development or colonization.

In one respect the devastation of Khorasan and western Iran was to the benefit of this part of Pakistan, for it led to the settling of a considerable number of pious and learned men, most of whom passed on towards Delhi, but many of whom stayed on in Multan. The preliminary disturbances of Ghauri times drove the Gardezi *Syeds* to this district. A little later, came a family of Qureshis from Khwarizm, which settled at Kot Karor in Leiah, and which gave birth to the famous Shaikh Bahauddin Zakaria or Bahawal Haq. About the same time Pir Shams Tabrez from Sabzāwar and Kazi Qutubuddin from Kashan came to Multan. Baba Farid Shakar Ganj settled in Pakpattan, Khwaja Qutubuddin Bakhtiar Kaki passed through Multan to Delhi and Syed Jalal, the spiritual leader of many families in Multan, Muzaffargarh and Bahawalpur, came to Uch. In the same period, rose Sakhi Sarwar, whose father emigrated from Bokhara to Sakot in Multan district. These venerable men contributed greatly to converting to Islam the Hindu section of the population, and it is to their influence and efforts that the people of this area owe their faith in Islam. From this time onward, the saints and the shrines of Multan bestowed upon the city a unique reputation throughout the Muslim world.

Under the Mughal Emperors, Multan enjoyed a long period of peace, and was known as *Dar-ul-Aman* (city of peace).

For 200 years, from 1548—1748, there was no warfare in this part of the Punjab.

As a result cultivation increased, particularly in the riverain areas, and commerce flourished. Multan thus became an emporium for trade. The city became the headquarters of a Province which covered the whole south-western Punjab and, at times, included Sind also. At the decline of the Mughal Empire, Multan had at first escaped the devastation which visited other parts of India. The route for the invaders from Afghanistan to India lay through Lahore, and the armies of Nadir Shah and Ahmed Shah Abdali left Multan unscathed. In the later days of the Empire, Multan Province became by degrees an appendage of Lahore. As the central power weakened, the Government gradually came into the hands of the Hindus, who laid the ground-work for the formation of revenue units which, subsequently led to the development of canal irrigation.

After having been a part of the Delhi Province, Multan in 1752 became a Province owing allegiance to the Afghan Kings of Kabul. During this period the country was ruled by Governors of Pathan extraction, and under the rule of the Sadozais of Kabul, a marked change took place in the fortune of those Pathan families, chiefly, Sadozais, who had fled from Afghanistan, and had taken refuge in Multan. By degrees, these families—known as Multani Pathans—acquired a good deal of power. The fief of Shujabad was held by Nawabs Muzaffar Khan and Sarfaraz Khan, who set up a kingdom, which was for all practical purposes, independent of Kabul. The Sadozai domains extended over both sides of the river Chenab. Only a little less than half of the district of Multan was in the hands of the Pathans. The rest consisting of Mailsi and Lodhran tehsils and southern half of Shujabad was in the hands of Daudputra chiefs of Bahawalpur. With

the decline of the power of the Multan Nawabs the Daudputras ceased to pay rent; but with the advent of the Sikhs, it was again strictly enforced. In 1831, when the Daudputras failed to pay the rent, the whole country west of Sultej passed into the hands of General Ventura and, later, of Dewan Sawan Mal. The Daudputra rule in the Sultej tehsils lasted for some 80 or 90 years, and their management of the country was, on the whole, popular. Between 1771 to 1818, the district witnessed continual warfare between the Multan Nawabs and the Sikhs from the north. Ranjit Singh stormed Multan in 1818; but contented himself for a time with putting in mediocre governors and it was not until 1821 when Dewan Sawan Mal was made Governor that Multan obtained any real peace of strong Government. For 23 years, the Chenab tehsils and for 13 years the whole district was under the rule of Sawan Mal. His rule was characterized by minute supervision of the details of the Revenue administration and extraction of the maximum income from the people. Dewan Sawan Mal was succeeded by his son, Moolraj, who subsequently resigned, and Sardar Kaan Singh was appointed as Nazim in his place in co-operation with Mr. Agnew and Lieut. Anderson. After the first Punjab War of 1845, there was no change in the Government of Multan, which continued as before under Moolraj. In 1849, Moolraj surrendered, and Multan came under British Rule. It became the headquarters both of the Division and the District. The history of the district since then has been mainly connected with the expansion of irrigation facilities. No administrative changes have occurred, although a proposal was made in 1959 to split up the district into two with a new district of Vehari comprising the tehsils of Vehari, Lodhran and Shujabad. Administratively Multan is the biggest district of West Pakistan comprising of seven tehsils. It is also the most

recorded in 1961.

1.14 ADMINISTRATION.

The district is under the general charge of a Deputy Commissioner, who combines the functions of District Magistrate as well as Collector. He is also responsible for co-ordinating the activities of all nation-building departments in the district. On the judicial side, he is assisted by an Additional District Magistrate and twelve Magistrates while on the revenue side he is assisted by two Revenue Assistants with a Tehsildar and a Naib-Tehsildar in each tehsil. For revenue administration the district is divided into seven tehsils namely, Multan, Shujabad, Vehari, Mailsi, Kabirwala, Lodhran and Khanewal, which have their tehsil headquarters at these respective places. Khanewal is also the Sub-division of the district under the charge of a Sub-Divisional Officer. The consolidation work in the district is being looked after by the Additional Deputy Commissioner.

The Police administration in the district is vested in the District Superintendent of Police, who is assisted by six Additional/Assistant/Deputy Superintendents of Police on the executive side. For police administration the district is divided into 23 police stations.

The judicial administration of the district is under the charge of a District and Sessions Judge, who is assisted by four Civil Judges. Muzaffargarh district is also under his jurisdiction.

1.15 BASIC DEMOCRACIES.

One of the most far-reaching and momentous reforms of the Revolutionary Regime was the introduction of Basic Democracies. The election to the Basic Democracies were held in early 1960. These institutions have created unprecedented social and political awakening among the masses, who are now eager to come to grips with the problem of poverty, illiteracy and disease in the rural areas. One of the principal aims of the Basic Democracies is the association of the people with the administration at each level and making the functionaries of Government accountable to the elected representatives of the people. The different tiers of the Basic Democracies with their structure and composition is indicated in the table below:—

The District Council consists of 48 members of whom 24 are appointed, and 24 are official members. The representatives of all the Departments in the district are members of the District Council.

1.16. IRRIGATION.

(a) Canals

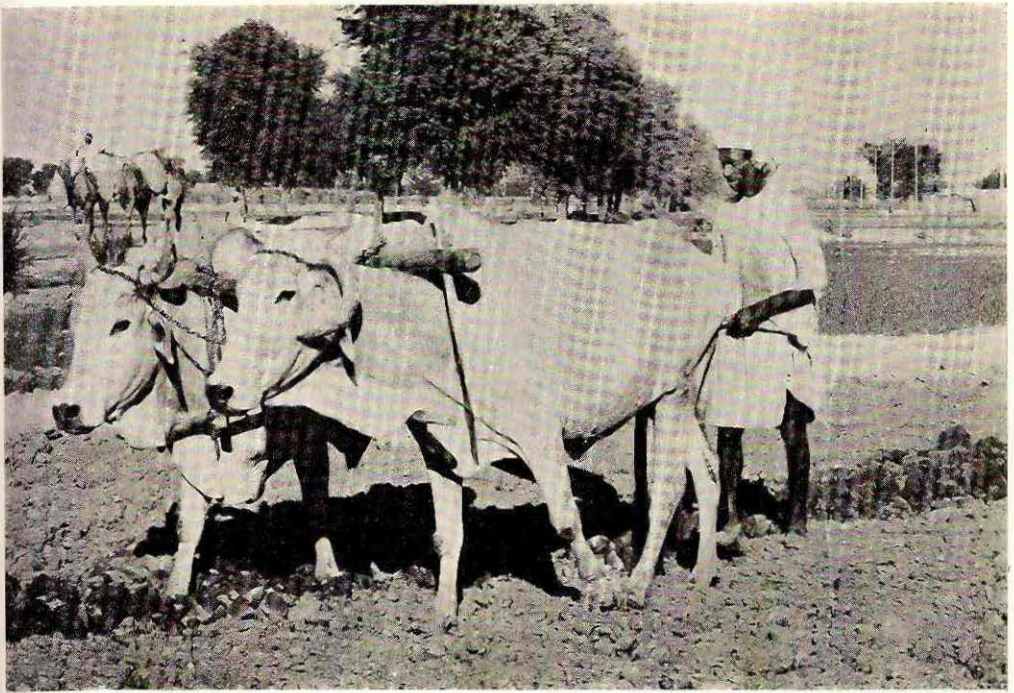
The district is irrigated by a net work of irrigation channels from various sources on the Rivers Ravi, Chenab and Sutlej. The area irrigated in the district forms a part of the jurisdiction of three Irrigation Circles viz:—

Haveli Canals Circle; Nili Bar Circle and Lower Bari Doab Canal Circle.

In *Haveli Canal Circle*, the district is fed by Ghag and Darkhana distributary of Haveli Main Line (off-taking from River Chenab at Trimmu), and Sidhnai Canal System, Kot distributary, Korang distributary, Abdul Hakim distributary, Hithar distributary and Fazal Shah distributary (all taking off from the river Ravi at Sidhnai Headworks). The *Nili Bar Circle* comprises the Pakpattan and Mailsi Canals and the *Lower Bari Doab Circle* comprises the Lower Bari Doab Canal.

The names and the area irrigated by each canal is indicated in the table below:—

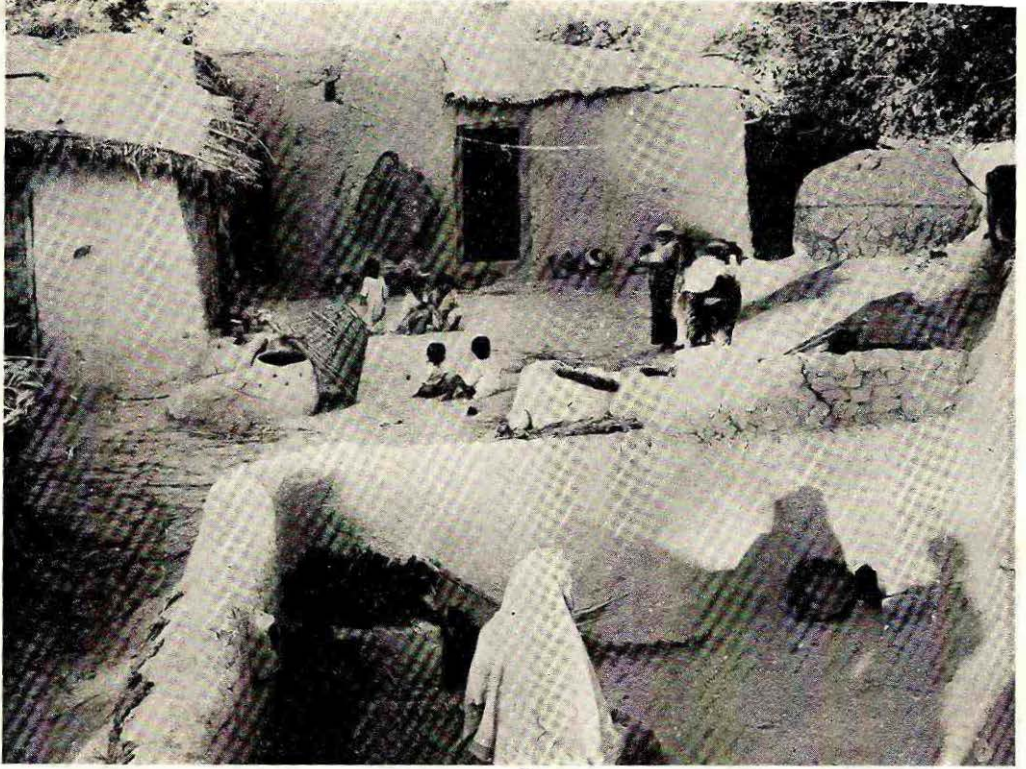

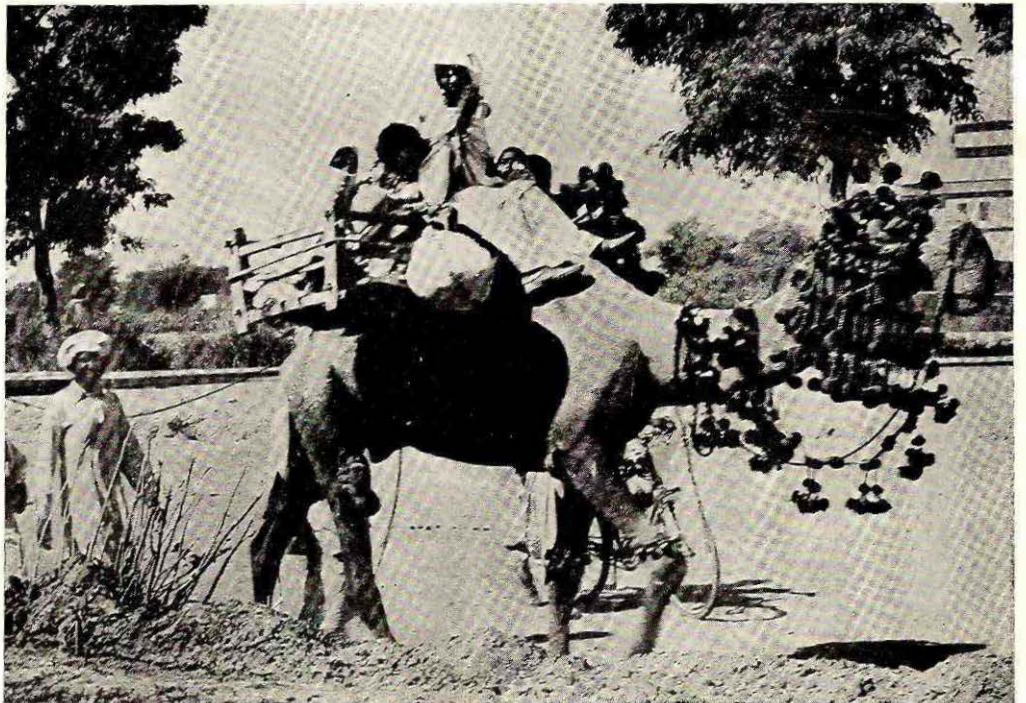

(b) Tube-wells.

The installation of Tube-wells especially Non-Perennial tract is fast increasing. In some of the tehsils, the Water and Power Development Authority has supplied electricity connections, but greater number are still run by diesel oil engines.

The total number of tube-wells is 1,398, of which 891 have been installed by the agricultural department and 507 through private agencies. The area irrigated by tube-wells is about 2,05,050 acres.

(c) Wells.

Irrigation by wells is an essential part of the agricultural system and their number has always been on the increase. In the Khanewal tehsil these are found only in the strip of land bordering the Ravi which does not receive canal irrigation. In the other tehsils, and specially in the non-perennial tracts these are commonly found. The form of well is the "Persian-Wheel" percolation wells. The present number of such wells is 35,370. They irrigate 2,82,920 acres of land.

17 AGRICULTURE.

The main crops during Rabi are : Wheat, Gram, Rape and Mustard, *Taria*, Barley and other cereals, and during Kharif are : Cotton, Rice, Jowar, Bajra, Maize and Sugarcane.

In addition to these two main crops, there are subsidiary crops known as *Zaid Rabi*

like *Kharbooza*, Tobacco and Potatoes and *Zaid Kharif* like Potatoes and Chillies etc.

The area under principal crops in acres in Rabi is:—

Wheat (9,59,952), Gram (69,777), Rape and Mustard (40,140), *Toria* (19,427), Barley (9,975) Other Cereals (3,145), Pulses (55,690) and Fodders (281,963), and in Kharif is : Cotton (5,93,320), Rice (29,316), Jowar (59,600), Bajra (73,435), Maize (28,693) and Sugarcane (48,183).

(a) Crops Husbandry practices.

The crops are sown either by broadcast or in lines. So far as wheat is concerned, it is estimated that about 40 per cent of area is sown in lines, while the remaining 60 per cent is sown by broadcast. As regards cotton about 60 per cent is sown in lines and the remaining 40 per cent is sown by broadcasting.

The harvesting of the crops is carried out mostly by sickles, except cotton which is picked mostly by female labourers.

(b) Agricultural Implements.

Agricultural Implements like *Munna* and *Sialko* ploughs are used. Some of the progressive farmers have taken up cultivation with improved agricultural implements like "Pakistan" and "Meston" ploughs, Automatic Rabi Drills, Single Row Cotton Drills, Bar Harrows and Tarphalies. All

these are worked by bullock power. Improved persian wheels are also becoming common and they are driven either by bullocks or camels.

(c) **Mechanised cultivation.**

Some of the big zamindars have taken up mechanised cultivation with tractors. The process, however, is confined only to cultivation.

(d) **Use of Fertilizer.**

The use of organic and green manures is very much restricted and is only confined to progressive farmers. The Cow-dung, however, is commonly used for manuring purposes. The green manure crops, like *Gowara* are mostly fed to cattle.

The use of chemical fertilizer is gradually gaining popularity and every year its use is on the increase. The total annual consumption of Ammonium Sulphate in this district is about 20,000 tons. It is mostly applied to wheat, cotton, rice, sugarcane and potato crops.

1.18 **HORTICULTURE.**

(a) **Fruits.**

The main fruit grown in the district are Mangoes, Maltas, Oranges, Sour Lemons, Sweet Lemons, Pomegranate, Guavas and Dates. Some good varieties of mangoes have recently been developed in government and private farms the most well-known of which are *Anwar Ratol*, *Dasehri* and *Langra* etc. The total area under orchards in the district is 16,494 acres, out of which about 8,247 is estimated to be under Mangoes. The orchards are generally scattered over in the district. The tehsils of Multan, Shujabad, Khanewal and Vehari have the largest area under gardens.

(b) **Vegetables.**

The principal vegetables grown in the district are potatoes, Chillies, Onions, Garlic, Cauliflower, Tomatoes, Brinjals, Sweet Potatoes, *Arvi*, Radish, Turnips, *Palik*

Peas and *Bhindi*. The total area covered is about 9,36,000 acres.

(a) **Roads.**

(b) Railways.

The Pakistan International Airlines have connected Multan, with Karachi, Lyallpur and Lahore with daily service both ways.

1.20 INDUSTRIES.

Before Independence there was hardly any large-scale industry in Multan. Since 1947, however, Multan has become an important industrial Centre, particularly of the textile industry as well as of other industries, allied to the agricultural produce of the district like cotton-ginning, vegetable oil etc.

(a) Large Scale.

There are about one lakh handlooms besides 5 big cotton mills in Multan. Among them Colony Textile Mills Ismailabad, Burewala Textile Mills Burewala, United Textile Mills Fazalabad and Co-operative Textile Mill Khanewal are important. The combined capacity of these Mills is 1,73,240 spindles and 1,878 power-looms. The average daily production of yarn in these Mills is 1,50,000 Lbs. and that of the cloth is 180,000 yards. There is also a woollen Mill viz., Colony Woollen Mills, Ismailabad which has 1,920 spindles and 36 power-looms.

There are two Art Silk Weaving Factories viz., Punjab National Silk Mills, and Multan

Silk and Rayon Mills, with a loomage of 100. There are six other smaller units with a strength of 100 looms which are engaged in the manufacture of Art Silk Fabrics. The monthly average production of these Mills stands in the neighbourhood of one lakh yards of cloth.

There are two Hosiery Units engaged in the manufacture of Hosiery goods viz., the Multan Knitting Mills and the Three Stars Hosiery.

Common Facility Centre.—To meet the growing demands of handloom units, the Government of West Pakistan has sanctioned a Common Facilities Centre which provides facilities to the handloom units in mercerising, finishing and calendering of yarn and cloth

Printing Units.—There are two textile printing mills viz., the Punjab Printing Mills and the Madina Textile and Printing Factory, with a capacity of 25 lakh yards per annum.

Cotton Ginning.—There are in all 68 cotton ginning factories equipped with 13,843 roller gins, 282 double roller gins, 137 saw gins, 40 presses and other machinery which utilises the cotton produced in the district. The average number of bales ginned during each year by these factories stands at 4 lakh. In addition there are about 20 Oil Mills with 100 expellers and machinery for extraction of oil. The average quantity of oil produced every year in these Mills is about 2,500 maunds with 15 lakh maunds, of cake which is used as animal feed.

The Qasimpur Industrial Colony has been set up with the help of the Industrial Finance Corporation and has four sections viz., Glass-ware, Foundry Works, Textile and Carpet Weaving.

Of these Glass Factory is the most important and it produces different varieties of glass-ware with an annual production to the tune of Rs. 7 lakh. The Qasimpur Indus-

trial Colony is now being turned over to private enterprise.

Vegetable Ghee Mills.—Two vegetable oil mills viz., Fazal Ghee Mills and Alhial Ghee Mills are under installation in Multan. The daily capacity of these Mills, when completed, will be 20 tons of vegetable oil.

Tanneries.—There are six tanneries which are engaged in the processing of leather. Of which Khawaja Tanneries, M. Muzaffarud-Din Tanneries, and Chenab Industries Khanewal, are big units.

Foundries and Workshops.—There are five medium sized agricultural implement manufacturing concerns which are engaged in the manufacture of agricultural implements, textile machinery, sugar-cane crushers, chaff cutters and cutlery articles, etc. The average annual production of these units is in the neighbourhood of 10 lakhs.

Metal Works.—There are four units engaged in the manufacture of household utensils, of which Pak Metal Works and Pak Aluminium Multan, are important. There is also one unit engaged in the manufacture of surgical equipments, furniture and steel trunks.

Cold Storage Plant.—There are three Cold Storage Plants, with a capacity of 17,000 bags in operation and two more plants are being put up.

Sewing Machines.—There is one unit viz., Jageer Sewing Machines Manufacturing Co., in operation, the annual production of which is in the neighbourhood of Rs. 1,37,500.

Flour Mills.—There are 2 roller flour mills with a combined capacity of 185 maunds. per hour.

(b) Cottage Industries.

There is a varied range of cottage industries in the district, the more important of which are handloom, blue pottery, camel skin painting, lacquer works, carpet weaving, soap making, fruit preservation, thread-ball making, *Zari* making, perfumes and furniture. Multan is particularly famous for the first four of these Cottage industries. Among the handlooms units the name of Gultex is known widely; they are also making carpets, besides bed and table linen. For blue pottery the firm of Mr. Noor Ahmad is famous. Camel skin painting is a speciality of this district and various articles like lamps and lampshades etc., are made from it which command a big market. Lacquer work is also one of the traditional handicrafts of this district. Wooden Toy-making is fast becoming a profitable cottage industry.

The village industries consist mainly in the weaving of coarse cotton cloth and the making of ropes, mats and *Tokras* etc., from the *Sarkanda* or date palms. Some villages and towns are well-known for special industries such as Tulamba and Kehror are famous for printed cloth for bed covers. Thatta Paolian and Jalalpur are well-known for chequered saddle cloths and other forms of cloth-work. The confections, such as *Papar* and *Rewrian* of Shujabad are famous throughout the district. At Wacha Sandila wood-work such as cot legs etc. is well turned out.

Both men and women are engaged in the above cottage Industries. While the work connected with embroidery, tailoring and crochet is generally done by the women folk. Men are engaged in Cottage Industries such as handlooms, carpet weaving, canvas, skin painting.

CHAPTER 2

PEOPLE AND THEIR ENVIRONMENTS

2.1 POPULATION.

The total population enumerated in 1961 was 27,02,354 out of which 14,52,036 were males and 12,50,318 females. The population enumerated in 1951 Census, excluding non-Pakistanis, was 21,07,241 out of which 11,27,883 were males and 9,79,358 were

females. The percentage increase during the 10 years between 1951 and 1961 works out to 28.24%, the percentage of increase amongst the males 28.74 and among the females 27.67. The sub-joined statement indicates the population growth in the district for the period 1901 to 1961:—

2.2 DENSITY.

The average density of population per square mile in the district works out to 480. The position of the district in respect of population is 10th in Pakistan and 1st in West Pakistan. In order of density the district stands 32nd in Pakistan and 11th in West Pakistan.

The areas classified as urban in the district in the 1961 Census were:—

Multan Municipality, Khanewal Municipality, Burewala Municipality, Mian Channu Town, Multan Cantonment, Kehror Pacca Municipality, Shujabad Municipality, Vehari Town, Mailsi Town, Jahanian Town, Tulamba Town, Jalalpur Pirwala Town, Lodhran Town, Abdul Hakim Town, Dunyapur Town and Kabirwala Town. In respect of urbanization district has registered an increase of 66.05 per cent over 1951 urban population. The principal reasons for mobility are industrialisation, and greater educational and employment opportunities in urban localities.

2.4 LANGUAGES AND LITERACY.

The principal mother tongue of the district is Punjabi. The other important language spoken in the district is Urdu. The percentage of people speaking these languages in the district is indicated in the table below:—

The number of literates recorded in the 1961 Census is 2,55,276 out of which 2,07,298 are males and 47,978 females, which gives an over-all percentage of 9.45. Considering the literacy figures by sex, the percentage of literacy amongst males is 14.28 and females 3.84.

The position of the district in respect of literacy in Pakistan is 36th and in West Pakistan 24th.

2.6 ETHNOGRAPHY.

Races.

The ethnographic composition of Multan district is determined by the fact that it has attracted a large number of immigrants not only from the neighbouring districts but even from far off districts on account of the development which took place due to the advent of canal irrigation on an extensive scale. Most of the important tribes now inhabiting the district have immigrated during the past several hundred years and the population has been in a state of constant flux.

Ethnologically, the population of Multan district is derived from Semetic or from Indo-Aryan races. But the elements of the two have got so closely intermixed during the past many centuries that it is impossible to find a pure specimen of any of the two races. This infusion of blood is mainly due to successive invasions and influx of peoples into the sub-continent.

2.7 COMPLEXION.

The complexion of the people is determined by the climate and temperature and skin colours vary from fair to dark. But generally the people have a wheaten complexion tanned by the intense heat of the summers. They are good statured having prominent features with dark eyes and dark hair generally.

2.8 TRIBES.

The district has a variety of tribes and castes. The main tribes are Syeds, Qureshis, Arains, Kambohs, Pathans, Balochs, Jats and Rajputs which have numerous castes and sub-castes.

The Syeds mostly belong to the more important families—the Jilanis and the Gardezis. The Syeds settled at Kotla Saadat in Multan tehsil immigrated from Kani-guram in Waziristan. There are several

families in the neighbourhood of Kehror called Jabli Syeds— from the mountain “Jabal” in Arabia. The Syeds are held in great respect by the people. Closely allied to the Syeds are the Qureshis, who are confined mainly to the families of Makhdums of Bahawal Haq, and are guardians of the shrine at Makhdum Rashid. There are a few Shaikhs, Ansaris and some tribes claiming Arab descent. The Pathans are an important tribe of Multan, and their first settlement in the district took place during the reign of Emperor Shah Jehan. The Multani Pathans belong mostly to clans of Abdali and Durrani. They live mostly in Multan city, although a few Pathan families own land in the neighbouring villages. Besides the indigenous Pathans, there are some Powindahs also, who work as labourers. Of the settled Pathan families, very few speak Pushto, and they have no connection at all with their fellow tribesmen in the Frontier or across the border. The Baloch are confined mainly to Lodhran tehsil and its immediate neighbourhood. They first came to the district during the latter half of the 15th century, when the Dodais and, afterwards, the Rinds made incursions into the district. The Baloch are chiefly Rinds and Korais. For all practical purposes, they have lost their original characteristics and become part of the indigenous Jats through free inter-marriages. Some of the Baloch men still wear long hair, and amongst the Rinds the married women wear white clothes only. The Daudputras although claiming a separate origin are commonly looked upon as Baloch. Many families claim to be Mughals, but considering the fact that Multan was overrun by Mughal invasions a number of times, there are relatively few families which can show pure Mughal or Turkish origin. The Chughatta, *kaum* and Aibaks are some of the Mughal clans.

The Arains of Punjab attribute their

origin to Multan, although the Arains of Multan claim that they came from Hindustan. The Jats and Rajputs are important agricultural tribes in the district. The former are divided into innumerable clans, like Sials, Thahims, Traggars, Wains, Bosans, Khokhars, Marrals, while the latter are divided into Noons, Drigs, Langahs, Joyas, Mitrus, Khichis, Langrials, Dahas and Buchas who are all Rajputs. If the history of the above tribes is investigated, it will be found that there is scarcely a single important tribe now found in the district which has not immigrated within the last 500 or 600 years. In Kabirwala, Khaks, Pandas, Pahors and Sahus have a reputation of being the foremost ancient tribes in the tehsil. The earliest landmark in the immigrations of the district is the arrival of the Gardezi Syeds in the 12th century followed by the Qureshis, who came in the thirteenth. The Arains appear to have begun immigrating from central Punjab about this time. In Taimur's time, we find the Khokhars wielding considerable power in the north of Kabirwala; but their settlement in the present villages dates from the time of Humayun. Shortly after this, the Langahs, who came from Sibi, started a local dynasty and during the time of Langah supremacy began the incursions of the Baloch from the south. In the reign of Emperor Aurangzeb, arrived the Pathan refugees from Kandhar. The upheaval of the Sials in Jhang drove a section of them from Chiniot into the west of Kabirwala tehsil. About the middle of the 18th century, the Daudputras crossed the Sutlej and occupied Mailsi and Lodhran tehsils. The wars of the latter part of the 18th century and the beginning of the 19th, gave further impetus to change and amid the devastation which overtook the district, tribes were constantly leaving the desolated areas for new homes in safer tracts, and at the close of this period occurred the last great tribal immigration that of the Langrial

from Kamalia to Mailsi. After the advent of Sikh power, there was no marked immigration from outside. During the previous hundred years, the main changes in local population have been due to the colonization of the areas irrigated by the Sidhnai and Lower Bari Doab canals. Khanewal tehsil is inhabited mainly by colonists, and in the Kabirwala tehsil, settlers from the central Punjab form the important part of population.

The holdings of the Syeds are scattered all over the district, similarly the Pathans and Balochs are spread all over the district but most of them are found in Mailsi and Lodhran, and very few in Kabirwala. The localities of the Mohammadan Jats are very distinctly marked. The banks of the Ravi are held by the Sials, including their sub-divisions of Hirajs, Sarganas, Daduhanas, Panjawanahas etc. Along the Chenab to the borders of the Multan tehsil the villages belong mainly to Thahims and Taraggars. In Multan the predominance of any one tribe of Jats is not so clearly marked; but in Shujabad the Khokhars, Noons, Khakis, Langs and Langahs are found in more or less solid groups, and the remaining Chenab lands forming the *Hithar chak* of the Lodhran tehsil are held chiefly by Kachalas. In the rest of Lodhran groups are not so well marked, but in Mailsi the Joyas, with their sub-divisions hold almost all the Sutlej land. Behind these come extensive groups of Khichis, Arains, Syeds, Pathans and Mitrus while the Bar as far as it is habitable is occupied mainly by Langrials.

After Independence there has been an influx of Muslim refugees from various parts of India. The immigrants have mainly come from Panipat, Karnal, Rohtak and Hissar districts of India, although a considerable number have come from Amritsar, Jullundur and the former United and Central Provinces

of India. These immigrants have settled lands of non-Muslims throughout the district.

Multan district is the home of a few leading Syed and Qureshi families whose ancestors played an important role in the spread of Islam in this region.

Gilanis.—The first in descent is the family of Hassan Hussaini or Gilani. The ancestor of this family was Hazrat Abdul Qadir Gilani known as *Piran-e-Pir*. Sheikh Jaha Bakhsh *alias* Sheikh Muhammad Ghaus, the 10th in descent from Abdul Qadir migrated from Baghdad to Uch in the time of Taimur. His son Pir Musa Pak Shahid was born there in A. H. 952 (A. D. 1535) and he was so renowned for his piety that his father, setting aside his eldest son, appointed him his successor. He was killed in a raid in 1593 A. D. by one Sultan, a Langah. He was first buried at his father's feet at Uch, but in obedience to a vision, his body was subsequently removed, first to the village of Mauza Hatti and afterwards to Multan, where it was finally buried in the present *Khangah* near the Pak Gate. Ever since this the head of the family has taken the title of *Makhdam*. The descendants of Musa Pak Shahid are held in great esteem by all sections of the people.

Qureshis.—The family is descended from Baha-ud-Din Zakaria *alias* Baha-ul-Haq, who is directly descended from the Quraish tribe. He was born at Kehrur in A. H. 566 (A. D. 1149). After travelling over the greater part of Asia, he settled at Multan where he died at the age of 100 years. He had a great fame as a Saint. His great-grand-son Rukan-e-Alam was also a great saint and both have beautiful shrines in the fort of Multan. Their descendants are also held in great esteem and reverence.

Gardezis.—The Gardezi Syeds were once the most wealthy and influential in the district. They are also known as *Hussainis* from their

scend from Hazrat Imam Hussain and Sheikh Muhammad Yousaf a descendant of the late Muhammad Debach, great-great-grandson of the Imam Hussain moved to Multan in A. H. 481 (A. D. 1064) and acquired great reputation in sanctity and miracles and received large grants of land. There are many branches of this family, the *Makhdum* of Multan holds the title of Sheikh Raju and that of the other Sheikh Muhammad Yousaf.

Khakwanis.—The Khakwanis are said to derive their name from Khog or Khok (a wild boar) from their exploits in pig-sticking. The first branch of the family to appear in Multan was that of Malik Shah Pal, who with his brothers accompanied Humayun some 200 years ago. The family owned considerable land in the district prior to the land reforms.

2.9 RELIGION.

The population of the Multan district is predominantly Muslim and the large majority of them are Sunnis, with a few Shias and others. Christians are in a very small minority, while Hindus are negligible. The different religious sects have their own way of life, rituals and ceremonies, places and modes of worship. Generally speaking the influence of religion is noticeably greater in this district than elsewhere. The day to day life of the people, their profession, trade, social and economic life are all dominated by the influence of religion. In rural areas, the *Pirs* and *Murshids* wield great influence over the lives of the people and Multan is known as city of the *Pirs*. The rural population is very credulous due to lack of education and susceptible to superstitions, which explains the influence which *Pirs* and Shrines exercise over the people. With the expansion of education a more rational attitude is slowly developing, and the educated classes are less susceptible to the influence of *Pirs*. Religious instruction is being imparted through such

institutions as Khair-ul-Madaaris, Qasim-ul-Uloom and Anwar-ul-Uloom which are helping to reshape religious and cultural values. The impact of education and nationalism is being felt everywhere, but sectarian differences continue to agitate the minds of many orthodox Ulema. Multan has produced many well-known theologians and scholars of Islam, some of whom like Syed Attaullah Shah Bokhari, have left their mark on the political life of the country, who besides being a spell-binding orator was also a fervent nationalist and a great religious scholar.

2.10 DWELLING HOUSES.

The houses are generally constructed on high ground, and the existence of mounds is a notable feature of Multan city, on which houses are constructed. Qasim Bagh and Multan Fort are also situated on mounds. Multan is an ancient town with an old civilization and its central portion is thickly populated. Generally the houses are of small size and burnt bricks with an average of two to three storeyed buildings. The lanes are narrow and the houses congested preventing fresh air and sunlight from penetrating into the rooms. Open drain sewers are provided everywhere, but water supply is inadequate resulting in somewhat unhygienic conditions. Drinking water supply is mainly taken from wells and hand-pumps. This part of the town which belonged to non-Muslims is now inhabited by the refugees from East Punjab and other parts of India, who have immigrated into Multan after Independence.

With the growth in the population of the city, people have started coming out of congested localities and new colonies like Hassan Parwana, Officers Colony, Mumtazabad colony, Lawyers colony, Satellite town No. 1 and 2 have been developed. Modern bungalows and houses have been built by well-to-do persons with modern amenities.

In these localities piped water supply and electricity and sewerage has been provided. In these colonies all the houses are of *pacca* bricks with cemented floors and *pacca* roofs of reinforced concrete or bricks.

In the rural areas, the houses are of *kacha* bricks or mud walls and are generally constructed on high ground. These houses have roofs of beams, *karries* or *sarkandas*. Some old *pacca* houses also exist in the old villages. The big *zamindars* and other well-to-do people have *pacca* houses or bungalows. The houses are generally grouped together in the rural areas, except at some places where farmers have made their hamlets and live on their lands. In the rural areas facilities of sanitation, water-supply and other amenities are generally lacking and the living standard is comparatively low. There is hardly any decoration in the rural dwellings except in a few houses belonging to bigger landlords.

In the towns cattle kept by *Gujars* are responsible for creating insanitary conditions.

In the rural areas no special place is earmarked for cattle and generally cattle sheds are situated close to the residential houses in winter, while they are kept in open courtyards during summer.

2.11 DRESS.

An ordinary man in the rural areas wears a *Pag* or *Patka* (turban) on his head and sometimes a *Kulla* or cap inside. The style of dress amongst all tribes is uniform with hardly any tribal peculiarities. The Baloch no longer dress like the tribesmen across the Indus or the Pathans like their ancestors in the Frontier. The normal dress is a *waist* cloth or *majhla*, generally white or blue, and sometimes of bright colours in check design, a *chola* or shirt coming down to the knees generally of white colour but occasionally blue, and a *chadar* or plaid worn over the shoulders. The Arains gen-

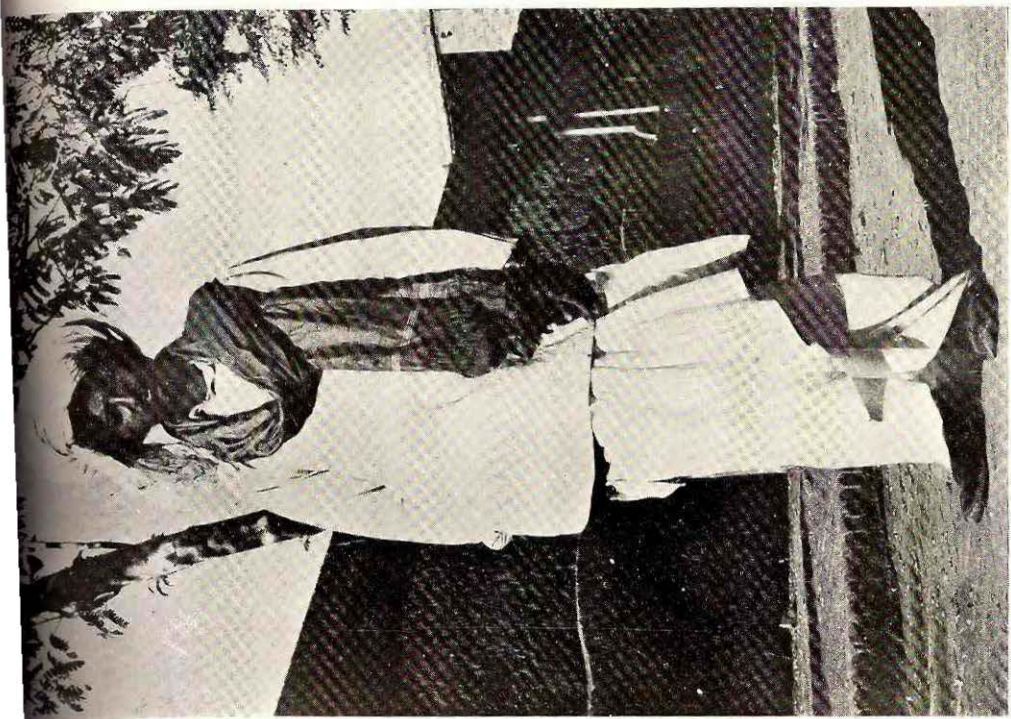
erally prefer the blue shade. The shirt known as *Chola* or *Kurta* is closed either by buttons or by a loop in front. The *Chaddar* which is thrown across the shoulders is frequently of rich material when it is called *lungi* or *khes*, while the *Chadar* of the poorer people is known as *blagal* or *lupar*. Some people use a *rumal* or kerchief of *Khaddar* or mill made cloth over the shoulders. In the towns particularly amongst the educated class western dress is common.

The dress of the women consists of the usual *shalwar* or *pajamas* or long shirted petticoat like *lehnga* or *ghagra*. The former is worn mainly in the urban areas while the latter is more common in the villages. The *chola* or *kurta* which is often of bright coloured striped cloth with short sleeves, is more common although sometimes a *choli* or *kurti* may also be seen in the rural areas. Over the head and shoulders is worn the *bochan* or *dupatta* which is generally of white or red cloth. *Pulkaris* and embroidered *chaddars* are not so frequent here. The women of the middle classes in towns and of the well-to-do classes in the rural areas observe *pardah* and are not seen outside their homes except in white or black *burqa*.

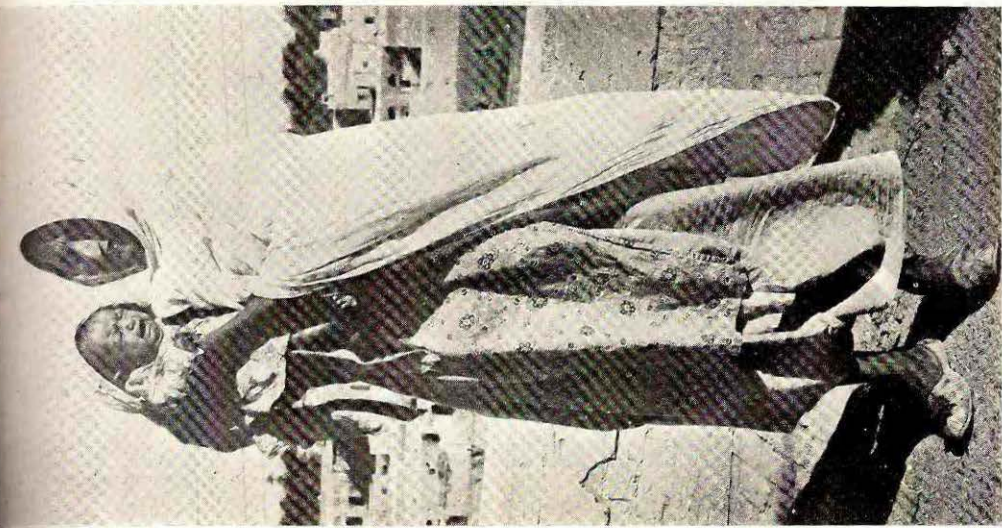
The men wear their hair short, although amongst the Baloch and Daudputras some people have long hair also. The women plait their hair before marriage, but after marriage generally wear them loose. Sometimes the hair is plaited and knotted on the top of the head.

2.12 FOOD AND HEALTH.

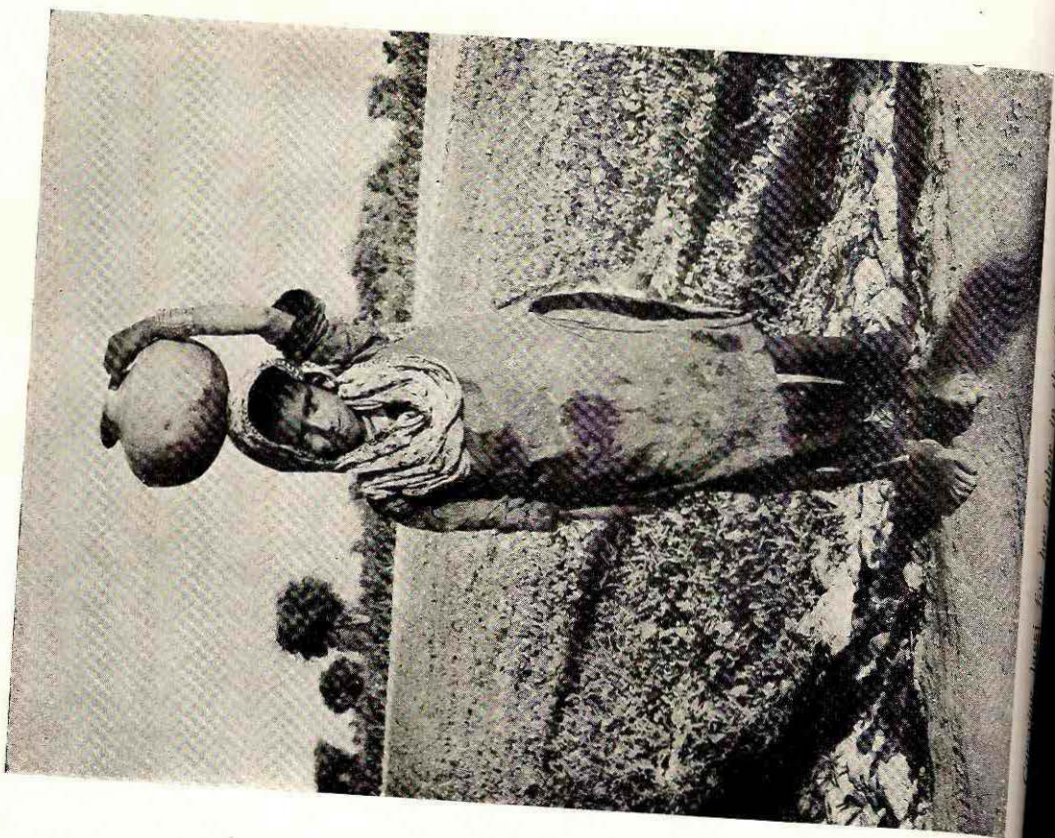
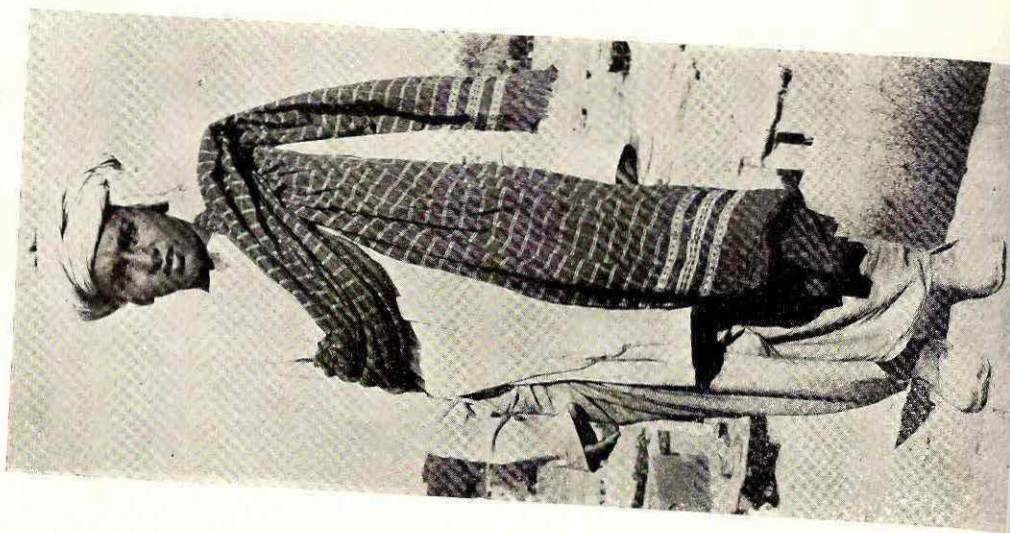
The staple food of the people is *roti* made of wheat *atta*, pulses and rice. The proportion of wheat to other grams consumed has increased much during recent years, but it still depends to a considerable extent on the means of the family, and to some extent the tract in which the family lives. Seasonal variation in food is also noticeable. Rice is generally eaten in this district. The

locally is not of the best quality and has to be imported from other parts of the poorer section of the people sometimes to eat *Jowar* and *Bajra* becomes scarce or its price rises to such means. The more prosperous and those living in the towns and villages eat vegetables with bread. The people frequently eat turnip stalks especially in bad years. The people in towns are generally much more fond of those eaten in the villages. The consumption of fish is becoming more and more a result of restrictions on slaughter of animals especially in the towns.

Meats of various kinds are used both in the towns and villages but their use is greater in the towns and more well-to-do than amongst the poorer classes. *Gur* and *Shakar* is used more in the villages, while sugar is used more in the cities. *Ghee* is the main cooking in the towns as well as in the villages though in the latter it is used by the poorer people only. Sweet-meats and cakes are much sought after in the towns and are common even in villages, especially at festivals and marriages.

Milk and Milk are universally popular in both urban and in the rural areas. In the towns *Dahi* prepared from fresh curd is eaten by all classes of people in the city and in the villages. The usual eating habit of a majority of people is to eat a meal at mid-day and again soon afterwards. Sweet-meats become a very much sought after article both in rural and urban areas. Drinking among men is fairly common in the towns and villages, but amongst the poorer people. Bathing twice or thrice in the towns is a necessity in summer, but in the villages frequency is reduced to alternate days or even less.

CHARACTERISTICS OF THE PEOPLE.

The characteristics of the Multani people differ from those of the inhabi-

tants of the people of the rest of Punjab. The character of the people also has certain peculiarities and it may be said that they are more self-centred.

The Multani peasant generally marries a neighbour and not a woman from a distant district. He, therefore, has a distrust of strangers.

The indigenous peasant of Multan is of a shy disposition and though among friends he is cheerful, he lacks the ready friendliness which is a characteristic of the other people of the central Punjab. This reservation has however now broken and with the growing contact of the people with the outside world and the settlement of a large number of the outsiders in agriculture, trade and industry, the Multani is hardly distinguishable from the other people of the Punjab.

An indigenous Multani is capable of sustained effort which is evident from the care and toil with which he cultivates his land. He is in no way inferior in physical energy and agricultural skill than his counterpart in the central Punjab although the relatively insusceptible climate and the excessive heat make him less capable of sustained hard-work than the people in the central Punjab.

The people are generally tall, well-built and good natured; in speech frank and outspoken, and in no way inferior in politeness and hospitality to the people of other districts.

2.14 CULTURE.

Culturally, Multan is not very much different from other districts of the former Punjab, although some ways of life and even language differs from the other districts. Excess of feeling for the welfare of relations and friends, hospitality and sincerity in one's dealings with other people, is the distinguishing mark of Multani culture. People greet each other warm-heartedly and make

profuse enquiries about the welfare of the other person, his family and relations. Improvement in communications and the extension of perennial canal irrigation have undoubtedly had an effect on the outlook even of the peasantry.

2.15 BIRTHS AND DEATHS.

Social customs and social controls influence the behaviour of the individuals as well as the community greatly.

(a) Births.

The birth of a child is celebrated even before the child is born. Pregnancy is received with an *Aura* of mystery around it. A pregnant woman is kept as far as possible away from all the negative and supernatural influences. The babe in the womb is supposed to take impressions from the things that influence its mother in her period of gestation. In the 9th month *Kanji* is celebrated. The parents of the woman send bridal clothes and green fruits for the expectant mother. When the pregnant woman is in labour various attempts are made to keep evil influences away from her. Pepper and Chillies are burnt at her door. The birth of the baby is announced and celebrated according to the sex of the new born. If it is a baby boy great festivities begin soon after his birth. The head of the new born is covered with *Za'fraan* and his lips are smeared with honey. The grandfather or the *Mullah* says *Azaan* in his ears. On the 8th day and in some cases on the 12th day, after the birth of the baby, the mother takes bath and is made to wear her bridal or new dress. About 5 days after the birth of the baby his head is shaved. This event is celebrated with a get-together, where the parents can afford, and where they cannot, the occasion is rounded off with the slaughter of the sacrificial lamb. Circumcision, in the case of the boy, which may take place with

the head-shave or may be postponed for quite sometime. Circumcision calls for another feast, the nature of which depends upon the economic status of the family.

(b) Deaths.

Soon after death has occurred all fire in the house is extinguished. The *nai* is asked to announce the sad news to all concerned. Womenfolk begin to wail and cry. Their mourning takes the form of ancient dirge. Men sit outside on a carpet, receiving people and telling the circumstances in which the death occurred. The dead body is washed with camphor. The near relatives are brought to get the last glimpse of the departed soul. Recitation from the Holy Quran and flowers (and something made of iron are placed near the dead-body). When all have collected together the body is taken to the graveyard and after saying the funeral prayers laid in the grave. Nothing is cooked for three days in the family of the bereaved. Food is supplied by the relatives of the deceased. Mourning continues for three days, and a ceremony known as *Qul* is held on the third day. On the fortieth day another ceremony known as *Chehlum* is held which is again an occasion of recitation from the Holy Quran and feeding of the people. The clothes of the dead person are distributed to the poor. Regular visits to graveyard continue for a period of eleven days.

2.16 BETROTHAL AND MARRIAGES.

Mostly marriages are arranged by the parents. It seldom happens that the betrothed pair know each other. Even if the two happen to know each other, the make-believe of strangers remains. There is a professional class of women, who are experts in the art of match-making. They have their fixed areas of operations. They effect matches by lauding the abilities of the boy and the beauty of the girl. The material prosperity of the boy is taken into special con-

sideration. When the agent has done her work of canvassing, she brings the two parents together. The parents of the boy see the girl and watch her behaviour and look at her critically from the point of view of physical appearance and efficiency as house-wife. If she is approved, the mother of the boy places a rupee-coin under the feet of the girl which means that the girl is approved. They come back and announce the decision by sending sweets to friends and family members. After some weeks the parents of the boy visit the parents of the girl to decide the date of marriage. They go in a family group, take fruits with them and also a set of bangles, a ring and some clothes. They are entertained by the parents of the girl. A date relating to the lunar calendar is fixed. Brisk preparations begin. On the first day of moon calendar, the month in which the ceremony is to take place, *Shadmana* begins to play. Players of *Shehnai*, *Nafeeri* and native drum constitute the *Shadmana*. They sit in front of the boy's house and keep on playing till the day of marriage. During these days the *nai* is the master of the ceremonies. Special guests and relatives are not invited by messages. The parents themselves go to invite them. Two days before the actual ceremony the womenfolk of the boy's side go to the girl and smear *mehndi* on her hands and feet. However, before this, a ceremony called *mehndi* has already taken place. The girl is almost locked in a room where only her friends and relatives can visit her. She is kept in shabby clothes, and women keep on smearing *Cheekoo* on her—a preparation of herbs made to brighten up the face. Her Prospective in-laws make their first visit to the girl. She is made to sit on a wooden platform wearing only a *chadar*. The in-laws open the *mehndi* and put oil in her hair. This is followed by *mehndi*.

On the day of marriage, the bridegroom comes along with a host of relatives and friends, riding on a horse, wearing colourful

clothes and a *Lungi* on his head. He washes himself at the girl's house and wears clothes given to him by his in-laws. After the *nikah* he is presented before the womenfolk of the bride's side. There is an interesting and wide-spread custom which is followed by all classes of people. The bride's sisters hide the bridegroom's shoes and until he has paid the customary amount of money to the bride's sisters, he is not allowed to go. After dinner, music and playful dances, the *barat* returns. Holding his wife he enters the bed chamber but not before the sacrifice of a goat has been made at their door. He holds the girl in his arms and takes her to the bed chamber. He has a knife in his hands to save him from evil influences on the first night. Two days after the marriage the girl returns to her parents on, what is called, *Satwara* when she relates to her mother all that happened to her during the first two days of her married life. After two days her husband and the in-laws come to take her back to where now she belongs.

2.17 MAIN AND SUBSIDIARY OCCUPATIONS.

Main means of livelihood are derived from agriculture and pasture, from industries relating to textiles, dress, uilding-trade and from transport. The bulk of the population is dependent on land. Skilled labour, Government services and service of Semi-Government Institutions, sheep breeding, poultry, cottage industries also serve as a source of subsistence to a considerable number of people. Commerce, trade, merchandise and shop-keeping also absorb a good number of persons particularly in the towns.

There is no seasonal migration for work except in the case of very poor people, viz., *Mussalis* etc., who go to the fields for the harvesting of Rabi crops. During working hours the people are quite active. The working hours begin a little after dawn, and end by dusk. Even the shop-keepers do

not conduct business after evening. The women and children of middle class people and of lower section of the population also work in their homes. The womenfolk and the children of peasant and petty peasant proprietors also work in the fields. In towns work connected with embroidery, tailoring and crochet is generally done by the womenfolk. The children who do not go to schools usually assist their parents in their day to day work or profession.

2.18 FESTIVALS, FAIRS AND MELAS, ETC.

Religious festivals, in Multan, are a peculiar mixture of devotion and lusty enjoyment. Multan is famous for its innumerable *Khangahs*. Annual *Urs* is held on every *Khangah*. Very well known are *Urs* Rukn-i-Alam, Bahawal Haq, Shah Shams Sabzwari, Shah Jamal, Sher Shah and *Mela* Luddan Peer. The object of an *Urs* or religious *mela* is to pay homage to the departed saint, and to pray for one's own salvation. And that is the spirit in which people prepare themselves for such occasions but actually, there is not much of religious fervour in what takes place at the *mela*. People distribute food to the poor and they offer prayers, but the religious aspect of it ends there. This is followed by dances, music, *kushti*, *kabaddi*, gambling etc., in short, a minor Dionysian ritual. This shows that such religious festivals afford people a holiday playfulness. Preparations are made long before the festival. People prepare themselves and their animals for different competitions, get new clothes made and save money to spend on different entertainments. The *Urs* lasts for about three days. The first day is usually devoted to *Nazrana*, *Mannat* and the exhibition of physical prowess. The second and the third days are reserved mainly for merry-making. On the last day, plans are made for what is to be done on the next meet.

Besides this, the two *Eids* and *Muharram* are also celebrated with a religious sanctity and the seasonal *melas* of *Basant* and *Baisakhi* are also celebrated widely.

2.19 GAMES AND SPORTS.

Besides the festivals and *melas* mentioned above, the people have other means of recreation and entertainment as well. In cities cinemas and clubs, literary symposiums, *mushairas*, dramas, music and dance on festive occasions are developing fast and are becoming regular features of day to day life of well to do people. In rural areas people entertain themselves with occasional cattle shows in which they make merriment by participating in dance and singing folk songs. *Kabbadi* matches, camel fights, bull fights, as well as races, *Kushti*, folk plays (*Bhands*) *Gatkas* and *Wagti* competitions etc., are commonly arranged in these festivals. There are of course no routine entertainments and generally after a hard day's labour, in the evening, men sit in groups and gossip.

Organised sports and games are common in urban areas. Foot-ball and cricket are the more popular games. Hockey, volley-ball, tennis, etc., are played widely. Indoor games are restricted to a few. Hunting and shooting also have some appeal in urban as well as in rural areas. In purely rural areas *Kabbadi*, wrestling, *Doda* and tent-pegging are favourite sports.

Musical instruments and the forms of artistic expression, in Multan are not very different from those that we find in other parts of the former Punjab. All the systems of *Punjabi* dance steps viz., *Luddi*, *Bhangrra*, *Kikli*, here called *Cheengil*, *Jhoomar*, *Summi*, *Gidda* etc., are equally popular in Multan. *Naqqarchis* of Multan also have a special fame. Multan has also a fair share of classical singers. The same conventional customs and instruments are used here as are practised in other parts of the Punjab, but with different local names. The verse

forms, too, remain the same. *Boli, Tappa, Mahia, Jugni, Dhola, Kissay* etc., are the most common forms of songs. *Kafi*, however, is typical of Multan. Khawaja Farid is the great master of this very popular form of poetry. The great art of spontaneous versification is peculiar to this region. On

occasions like births, engagements, marriage, harvest, death, separation etc., both men and women are quite capable of creating folk-songs of literary significance. Many such songs exist, but, no one knows who is their author and what occasioned their creation.

CHAPTER 3

IMPORTANT PLACES

3.1 KHANEWAL.

It is both a sub-divisional and tehsil headquarter of the same name. Its population, according to the Census of 1961, is 49,093, being 26,845 males and 22,248 females. In 1951 it was populated as 37,915, the males and females being 20,886 and 17,123 respectively. This shows an increase of 29 per cent during the decade. It is an important industrial town and a number of various industrial concerns are operating there. There are six cotton ginning factories, one Co-operative Textile Mill, four Ice factories and a cold storage. Grain and Vegetable markets are also functioning there. There is an Islamia Intermediate College, four high schools (three for boys and one for girls) and in addition a number of primary schools for boys and girls. It is an important Railway Junction on the Peshawar—Karachi main line. Being 38 miles away from Multan on Lahore—Multan Road all sorts of vehicles operate in it. The Civil administration is being looked after by the local municipality. A water-works has been constructed to supply water. There is also a Post Office and Telephone exchange.

3.2 SHUJAEAD.

It is the tehsil headquarter of the same name. Located on the main line between Multan and Lodhran it is about 32 miles from Multan. Its population, according to 1961 Census, is 16,815, being 8,889 males and 7,926 females. In 1951 it was populated as 14,601 males and females being 7,647 and 6,954 respectively. This shows an increase of 15

per cent over the preceding Census. It has a Municipal Committee which consists of union committees. There is a small water-works in the town. This town is electrified and the power station is run by Water and Power Development Authorities. There is one Government high school for boys and another Municipal high school for girls. In addition some primary schools for boys and girls also function in it. The town has got one *mandi* (market) which controls the trade of the rural areas. Wheat and Cotton are the chief crops exported from here. Mangoes are the main fruit exported to the parts of West Pakistan.

It has a historical Palace of Nawab Muzaffar Khan, who was once Governor of Multan, which was constructed in 1879.

3.3 KABIRWALA.

It is the tehsil headquarter of the same name. Situated on Multan—Lahore Road it is 29 miles away from Multan and 9 miles from Khanewal. Its population, according to 1961 Census, is 5,326, being 2,826 males and 2,500 females. In 1951 it was populated as 4,330, males and females being 2,244 and 2,086 respectively. This shows an increase of 23 per cent over the preceding Census. The town has a town committee but there are no water-works and electricity arrangements. There is a high school for boys and a municipal school for girls. The only scenic place is Sidhnai Headworks, 19 miles from Khanewal, from where Sidhnai Canal has been taken out from River Ravi.

3.4 MAILSI.

It is the tehsil headquarter of the

name. It is 54 miles away from Multan and is connected by rail and road. Its population, according to 1961 Census is 13,617, being 7,378 males and 6,239 females. In 1951 it was populated as 10242, males and females being 5,490 and 4,752 respectively. This shows an increase of 33 per cent over the preceding Census. There is a town committee in it. Drinking water is supplied by hand-pumps and wells. There are no electricity arrangements. There is a high school for boys and a middle school for girls. There are three cotton ginning factories and one ice factory.

3.5 VEHARI.

Vehari is a tehsil headquarter situated on the Grand Trunk Road running from Multan to Lahore and a railway station on Lodhran—Kasur section of the Pakistan Western Railway towards east at a distance of about 63 miles from Multan. Various bus-services run towards Multan, Sargodha and Bahawalpur Divisions. Its population, according to 1961 Census, is 15,410 being 8,394 males and 7,016 females. In 1951 it was populated 8,986 males and females being 4,983 and 4,003 respectively. This shows an increase of 71 per cent over the preceding Census. It is a town committee. The water and electricity

arrangements are satisfactory. There is a Civil Rest House, one Hospital for men and another for women. Two high schools for boys and one for girls exist here. There are four cotton ginning factories, one ice factory and one oil factory to meet the local requirements. There is also a well-established grain market in the town. Since Vehari is a newly inhabited colony town, there are no relics or scenic places. This town has recently been declared as a sub-divisional headquarter for Mailsi and Vehari Tehsils.

3.6 LODHRAN.

It is the tehsil headquarter of the same name. Situated on the main line it is an important Railway Junction. Being 50 miles away it is connected with Multan by rail and road. Its population, according to 1961 Census, is 6,663 being 3,609 males and 3,054 females. In 1951 it was populated as 4,890 males and females being 2,694 and 2,196 respectively. This shows an increase of 36 per cent over the preceding Census. There is a town committee here but no water, works or electricity arrangements exist. There is one high school for boys, one middle school for girls and three primary schools for boys and girls. It is a cotton cultivating area. One cotton ginning factory is functioning here.

CHAPTER 4

MULTAN CITY

4.1 HISTORY.

The date of the founding of the Multan city is unknown. It is probable that Multan was the city of the Malli which Alexander stormed and where he was wounded, and the first real appearance of the town in history is in the middle of 7th century A.D., when it was seized by the Chach Dynasty of Sind.

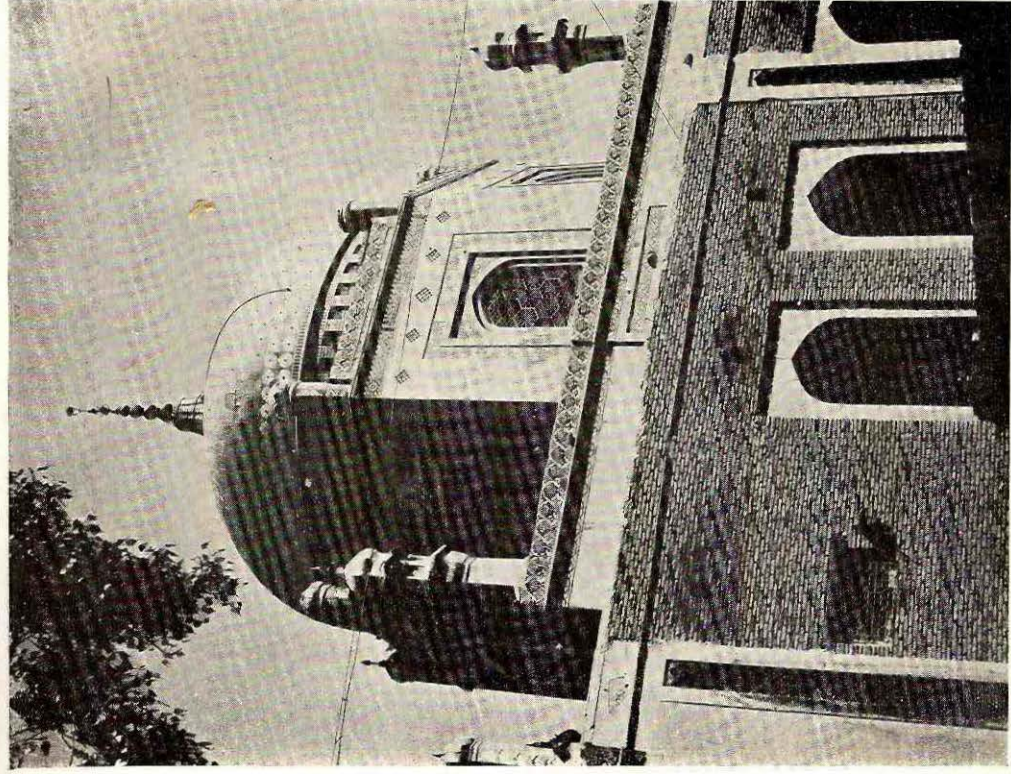
The general history of Multan city is much the same as that of the district. It was visited by many European travellers. Still and Crowther described it in 1614 as a great ancient city within three *kos* (about a distance of four miles) of Indus, but poor for which cause they detain the carvans there for many days to benefit the city. Thevenot writing towards the end of the 17th century described Multan as being watered with many rivers that make it fertile. According to him it furnished Hindustan with the finest Bows that are to be seen in it and the nimblest dancers, and Elphinstone writing in 1808 described Multan as being 4 miles from the left bank of the Chenab and about 4.5 miles in circumference. It is surrounded with a high wall with 40 and 50 feet high towers at regular distances. It has also a citadel on a rising ground and several fine tombs, especially two with very high cupolas, ornamented with the painted and glazed tiles. The tombs are seen from a great distance around the town. Multan is famous for its silk and a sort of carpet. The country immediately round the city is pleasant, fertile and well cultivated and well watered from wells. Masson writing in 1827 described its bazars as large but inconveniently narrow and not exhibiting that bustle or activity which might be expected of a place of much reputed commerce.

The city of Multan is bounded on the north by the depression lying between it and the fort and on all other sides by a brick wall. It has six gates in the following order:—The Lahori or Lohari gate at its north-western corner; the Bohar gate at its south-western corner, next to the Bohar gate on the south is Haram gate and then the Pak gate. On the eastern side is the Delhi gate and on the north-eastern corner the Daulat gate. The bastion at the south-eastern corner is the Khuni Burj where the British troops in January 1849 stormed the city. On the northern side is a wide approach to the city rising from the old bed of the Ravi and known as the Hussain Agahi.

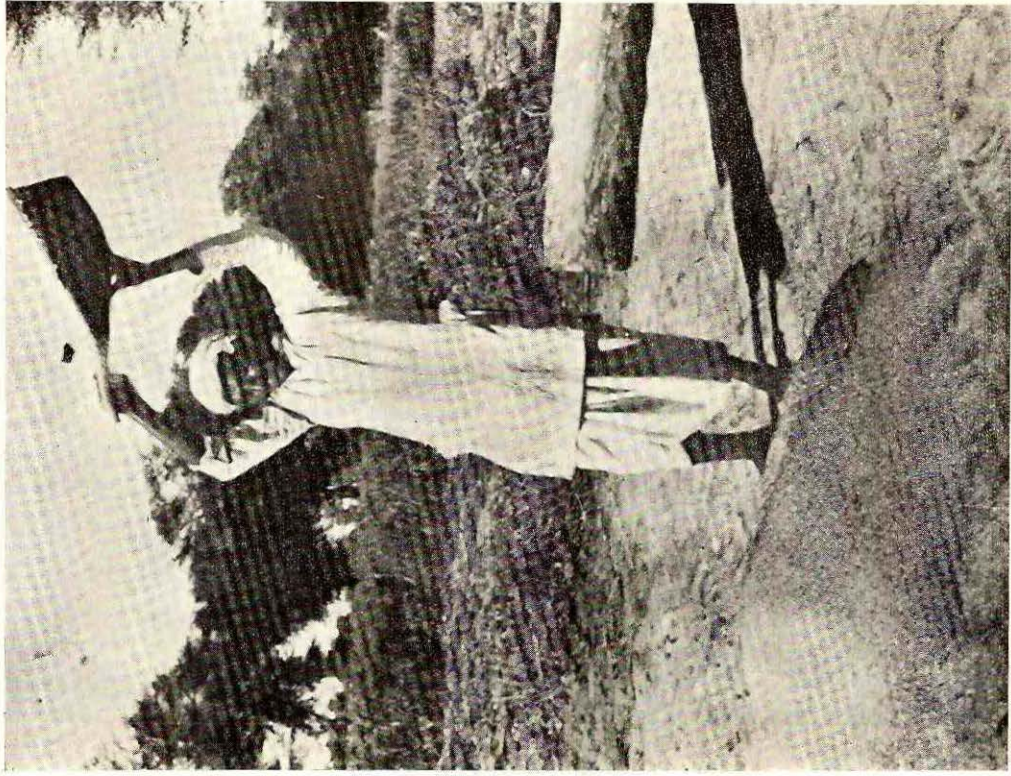
Multan has the honour of being the birth place of three distinguished men in history. Muhammad Tughlak Shah is said to have been born here at about the end of 13th century in a hamlet lying between the Lohari gate and the civil lines Church which is to this day known by the name of Toleh Khan, which is a corruption of Tughlak Khan. Emperor Bahlol Lodhi was also born here in the house known as Khizanawala Maun near Hussain Agahi. His birth was prematurely occasioned by a falling house which killed his mother. Ahmed Shah Abdali, the first Durrani sovereign of Afghanistan, is said to have born in Multan at about the end of 17th or beginning of 18th century in a Saddozai Kirri in the suburbs of Multan at the spot now occupied by the house facing the Commissioner's residence.

4.2 POPULATION.

The population of Multan city was returned at 1961 Census at 3,58, 201 of which



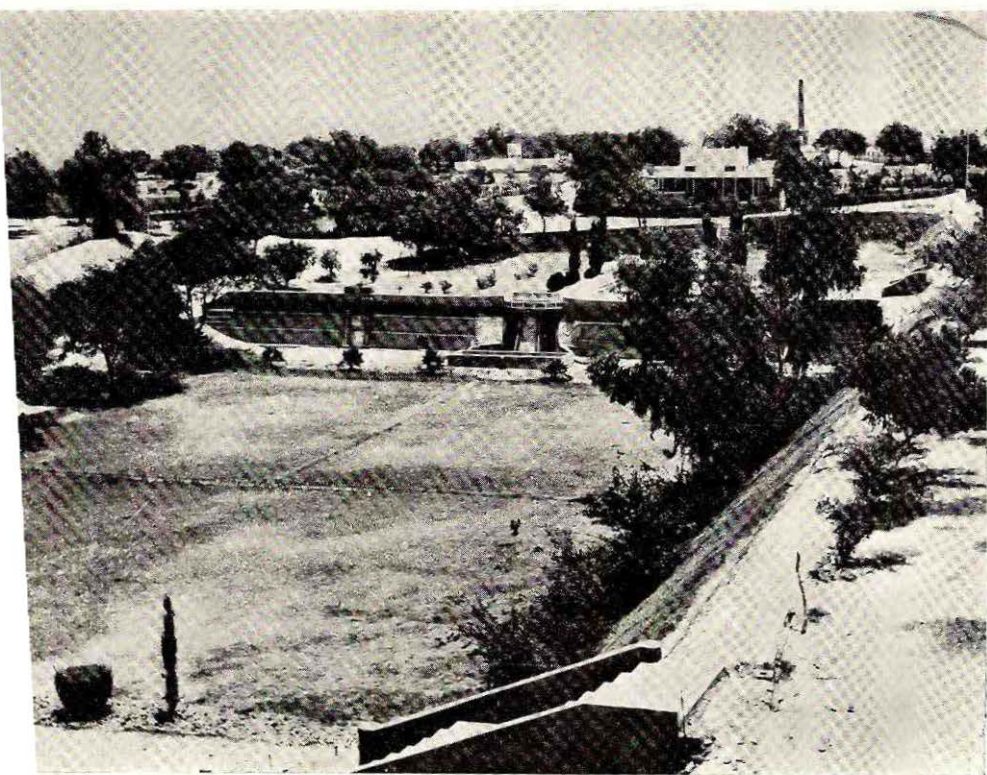
Tomb of Shah Shamas Sabzwari, Multan City.

1,99,284 were males and 1,58,917 females. This has shown an increase of 1,78,079 with a percentage of 99 as compared to the Census of 1951 when the population stood at 1,80,122—1,04,478 males and 85,644 females. The number of females per one thousand males in 1961 is returned at 797 as compared to 820 in 1951.

4.3 LOCATION.

The city lies on the Karachi-Lahore-Peshawar Railway line and is bounded on the north by the depression lying between it and the fort, and on all other sides by *alang* formerly a brick wall. The old town has always been very densely populated. It has narrow bazars and narrow winding and unhygienic lanes and small and ill-ventilated houses which have undergone divisions in the course of generation. It cannot accommodate the large number of persons that crowd in it. Besides the Cantonment areas numerous other centres of houses have been constructed under Government and private inspiration during the last decade. The new schemes, satellite town-ships and industrial estates are well-planned and have sanitary arrangements and broad streets, and the houses are bigger and well-ventilated.

Multan has a Municipality which was constituted in 1867. The constitution of the Committee consists of 36 members.

4.4 EDUCATION.

A number of Educational Institutions have been founded. The most important of them is the Nishtar Medical College, which is one of the great new colleges started after the creation of Pakistan. Along with it is the well-equipped Nishtar Hospital. The Emerson Government College is an old institution. In all as many as 11 Colleges, higher secondary schools and high schools for boys and girls have sprung up to meet the growing educational needs. Most of

these schools are run by private enterprise. There are 40 primary schools for boys and 39 for girls maintained by the Municipal Committee.

4.5 COMMUNICATION.

The most beautiful road is the Ahmad Shah Abdali Road. The other main roads are Aurangzeb Road, Tughlak Road, Water Works Road, Bahawalpur Road, District Courts Road, Nishtar College Road, Dara Shakoh Road, Hasan Parwana Road, Eidgah Road, Hazoori Bagh Road, L.M.Q. Road, Azmat Wasti Road and Altamash Road. The types of transportation in the town are the Government Omni Bus Service, Private Buses, *Tongas*, Taxis. The *Tongas* are still the main means of transportation. A civil Aerodrome has been constructed recently and daily services of Pakistan International Airlines are regularly serving.

4.6 PLACES OF RECREATION.

There are numerous places of recreation and places of amusement in Multan of which important are Qasim Bagh, Lange Khan Garden, Aam Khas Garden, Bohar Garden, Chowk Shaheedan Park, Tibbi She Khan Park and Nawan Shaher Park. The Town Hall is one of the most beautiful Town Halls in whole of the Province. It is quite imposing double storey building. There is also a sports stadium in the Fort Area.

4.7 HOTELS AND RESTAURANTS.

The city abounds in Hotels and Restaurants, chief of those being Firdaus Hotel and Restaurant, Aziz Hotel and Restaurant, Guild Hotel and Restaurant, Royal Hotel, Sindh Punjab Hotel, The Multan Hotel and Restaurant, Alharam Hotel, Mumtaz Hotel and Restaurant, Mailsi Hotel and Restaurant, Cafe Arafat and Khan Cafeteria.

4.8 IMPORTANT COMMERCIAL CENTRES.

The important commercial and shopping Centres in the city are Chowk Bazar, Bohar Gate Bazar, Haram Gate Bazar, Delhi Gate Bazar, Hussain Agahi, Lohari Gate Bazar, Pak Gate Bazar, Circular Road, Railway Station Roads and Aurangzeb Road. The important commercial or industrial buildings are Chamber of Commerce and Industry, the Colony Textile and Woollen Mills, Muzaffargarabad, Fazalabad Textile Mills, Mumtazabad, the Pak Aluminium Factory, Masoom Shah Road, the Multan Electric Supply Co., Ltd., Napier Road, the Multan Transport Co., Ltd., Daulat Gate, the Wahid and Mailsi Transport Co. near Octroi Post No. 14, the Haryana Transport Co., Ltd., near O.P. No. 14, the West Pakistan Transport Co., Bohar Gate, the Hillal Tijarat, Chowk Bazar, Multan, the Gultex, Bohar Gate and the Tajtax, Lohari Gate.

4.9 ARTS AND MANUFACTURES.

The city is renowned for Arts and Manufactures, the most noted are glazed pottery, vitrous enamel, ornaments in silver, cotton and woollen carpets, silk fabrics and metal-work. People take glazed pottery, lacquered wooden vases and other ornamental objects, *durries*, and various varieties of printed cottons, decorative camel skin articles to distant places as presents. Large works have been built for the utilization of natural gas, namely the Fertiliser Project and the Power Station, which will increase agricultural produce and make the wheels of industry spin more effortlessly.

4.10 MUNICIPAL ADMINISTRATION.

The town is administered by a Municipal Committee and the Cantonment Area is looked after by the Cantonment Board. The Municipal Committee Multan is divided into 18 Union Committees and the Cantonment

area into 3 Union Committees. These Union Committees have been empowered to look after the sanitation arrangements and to facilitate local inhabitants in adjudication of disputes under the Conciliation Courts and Muslim Family Laws Ordinance.

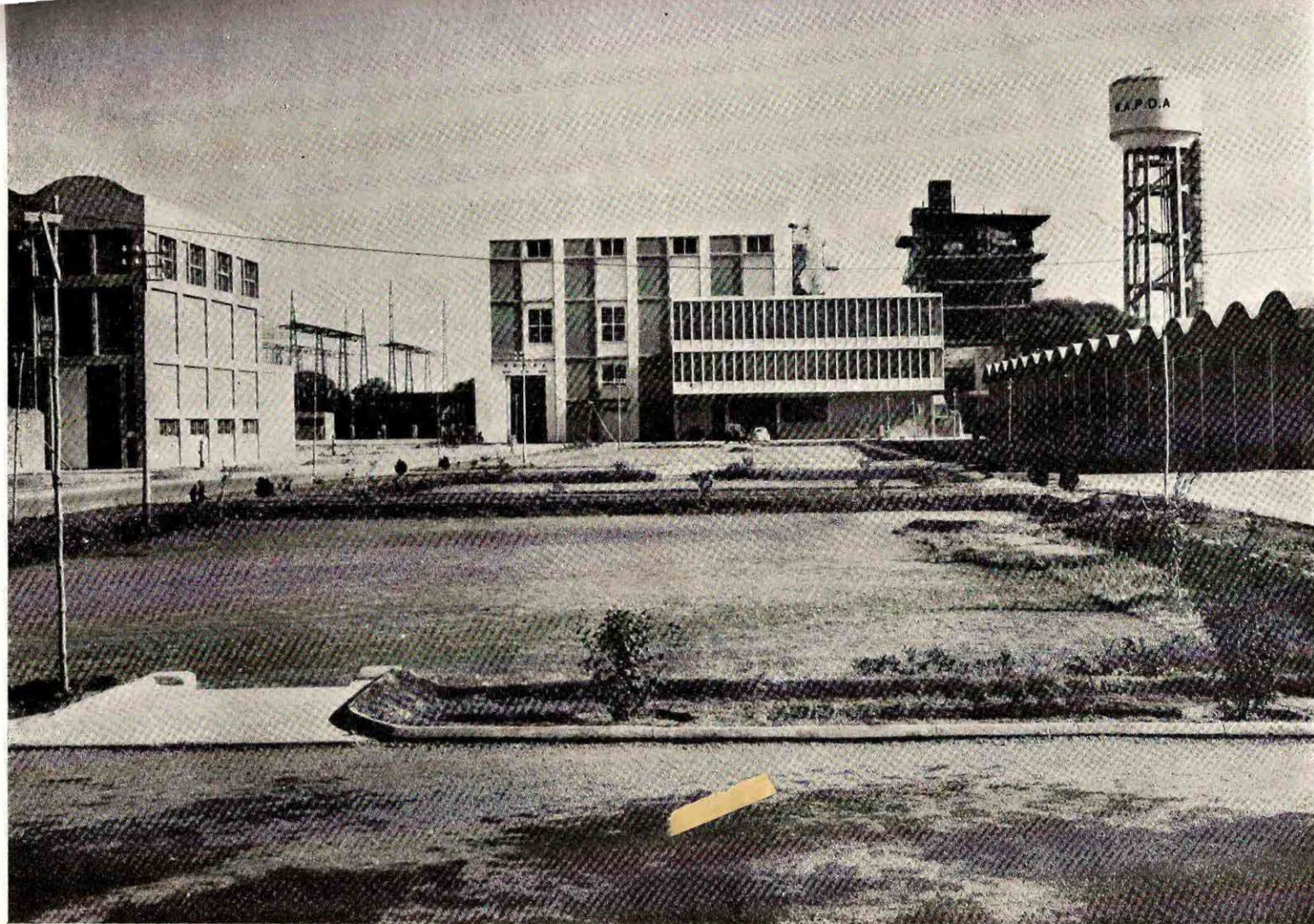
4.11 PLACES OF HISTORICAL INTEREST.

(a) Fort.

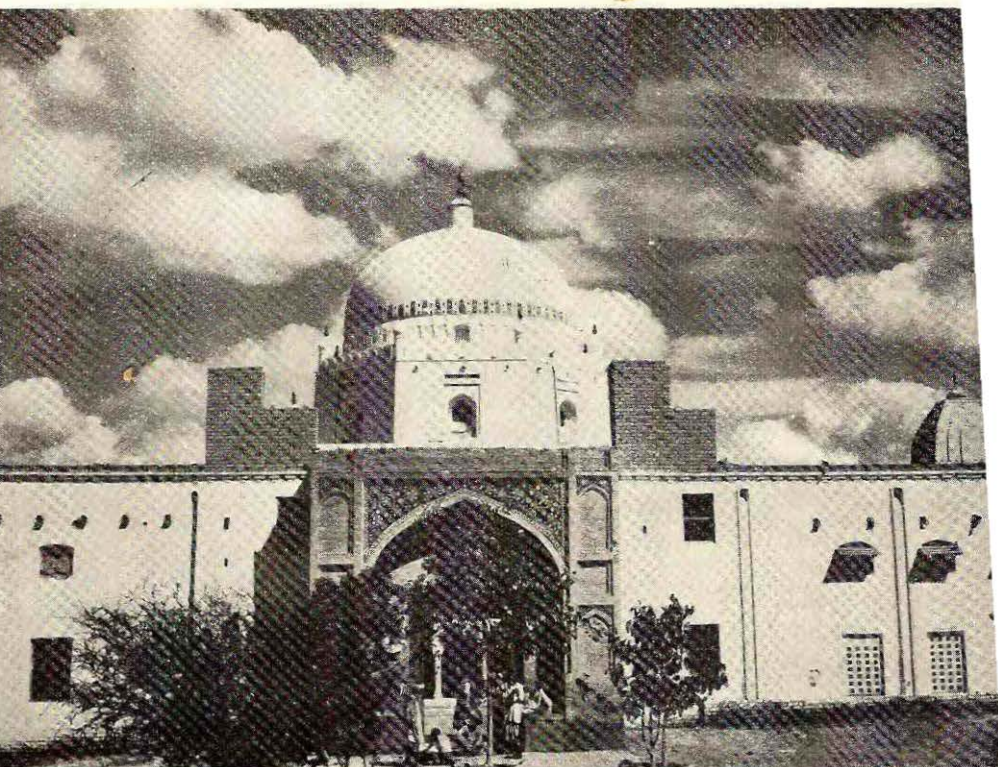
The Multan Fort is built on a detached mound of earth separating from the city by the bed of an old branch of the Ravi. Its date cannot be fixed with accuracy. When it was intact its circuit was 6,600 feet or about $1\frac{1}{4}$ miles and it had 46 bastions including two flanking towers at each of the four gates. The four gates were the Deh Gate on the west, the Khizri Gate on the north-east so-called because it led directly to the river which was under the protection of the saint Khawaja Khizr, the third the Sikhi Gate on the south-east and the 4th the Rehri Gate outside Hussain Agahi. For a long time after British occupation a Garrison was stationed in the Fort but the Fort is now destroyed having been ravaged by the British to avenge the murder of Mr. Agnew who was killed in 1848. Besides the Shrines there is a vast dome in the Fort which is said to have been a powder magazine of the Sikhs and a red stone obelisk built to the memory of Agnew. The entrance to the Fort has been restricted and the Kasim Bagh has been laid within the walls of the Fort. Recently a Stadium has also been built in which public functions and sports are held. A beautiful panoramic view of Multan city can be had from the highest point in the Fort.

(b) The Sun Temple.

The Sun Temple of which now no trace remains was situated within the walls of the Fort. It was probably destroyed by Aurangzeb.

(c) The Temple of Prahladpuri.

The temple of Prahladpuri was also situated on the north edge of the Fort. The story of Prahlad from whom the temple took its name is interesting. Prahlad son of Raja Harnakash who held sway over this country condemned the gods and forbade the doing of homage in their name. His son Prahlad Bhagat refused to obey, whereupon the father ordered a pillar of gold to be heated with fire so that Prahlad might be bound to it. When the twilight came and the servants attempted to bind Prahlad to the pillar, it burst in two and outsprang the god Vishnu in the form of a man-lion who laid the king across his knees and ripped him open with his claws. The temple is situated close to the shrine of Bahawal Haq.

(d) Mausoleum of Sh. Bahawal Haq.

In the west of the temple is the Mausoleum of Sheikh Baha-ud-Din Zakaria known as Bahawal Haq, who was born at Kot Kehrur near Multan about 1170 A.D. His father died when he was a child, but he grew in wisdom and studied in Turan and Iran. He received religious instructions from Sheikh Shahab-ud-Din Suhrawardi in Baghdad and became his *Khalifa*. He was on terms of great friendship with Sheikh Farid Shakar Ganj and lived with him for a long time. Bahawal Haq was for many years the great saint of Multan and has still a great following in the Punjab and Bahawalpur. The Mausoleum is said to have been built by the saint himself and according to Cunningham there is only one other specimen of the architecture of this exact period and that is at Sonapat (India). The Mausoleum contains besides the tomb of the saint and many of his descendants, that of his son Sadr-ud-Din. According to tradition, Bahawal Haq left enormous wealth, but Sadr-ud-Din distributed the whole of it to the poor.

Opposite the door of the Mausoleum is

a small grave of Nawab Muzaffar Khan who died defending himself against the Sikhs. In these precincts are also buried Shahnawaz Khan son of Muzaffar Khan, Makhdum Shah Mahmud, the late Makhdum Bahawal Bakhsh and most of the eminent members of the Qureshi family.

(e) Mausoleum of Rukn-i-Alam.

On the south-west side of the Fort is the magnificent Mausoleum of Rukn-i-Alam, the grand-son of Bahawal Haq. Rukn-i-Alam was a man of great religious and political influence during the Tughlak reign, and was in Multan when the city was visited by Ibn Batuta. According to Griffin, Rukn-i-Alam taught a form of metempsychosis, i.e., on the day of judgment the wicked would rise in bestial form suitable to the characters which they had borne on earth. The Mausoleum is an octagon about 52 feet of diameter inside with perpendicular sloping towers at the angles. This is surmounted by smaller octagon of about 26 feet exterior side and 27 feet in height. Above this is a dome of about 58 feet exterior diameter. The total height of the tomb is little over 100 feet but as the building stands on high ground, its total height above the road level is 150 feet, which makes it the most striking feature of the landscape and is visible from 12 to 15 miles distance. It is built entirely of red brick and the exterior is ornamented with glazed tiles of dark blue azure and white contrasted with the deep red of the finally polished bricks. The grave of Rukn-ud-Din is of plain brick work covered with plaster. The tomb was said to have been built by Ghias-ud-Din Tughlak for himself, but was given up by his son Muhammad Tughlak in favour of Ruk-i-Alam. Besides its religious importance, the Mausoleum is also of considerable archaeological value as its dome is reputed to be the second largest in the world after 'Gol Gumbad' of Bijapur (India), which is the largest.

(f) Memorial Obelisk.

Memorial obelisk in the centre of the Fort is to the memory of Agnew and Anderson who were murdered in 1848. It is 50 feet high with 5 steps to a pedestal 5 feet high. In the open space to the west of the obelisk is the tomb of Syed Darbar Shah Bukhari.

(g) Gardezi Shrine.

Gardezi shrine is the shrine of Muhammad Yusaf Gardezi near the Bohar Gate. It is a rectangular domeless building decorated with glazed tiles work of considerable beauty. Mohamad Yusaf was a descendant of the Holy Imam Hassan and was born in Gardez. He came to Multan in about 1088 A.D. and settled in Multan. He is reputed to have been a gifted man who could ride tigers and handle snakes.

(h) Mausoleum of Musa Pak Shaheed.

The Mausoleum of Moosa Pak Shaheed is inside the Pak Gate. Sheikh Abdul Hassab Musa Pak Shaheed was a descendant of Abdul Qadir Jilani and was born in Uch. Among his descendants was Hamid Ganj Bakhsh buried near Musa Pak Shaheed, Yahya Nawab buried near the Pak Haram Gate, Inayat Wilayat buried near the Haram Gate in a conspicuous tomb and Jan Muhammad buried in Delhi. The shrine of Musa Pak Shaheed is frequented by a large number of Pathans. Another shrine is that of Shahdana Shaheed near the Delhi Gate.

(i) Mosques.

Amongst mosques of note is the Wali Muhammad Mosque in the Godri Bazar in the heart of the city which was built by Ali Muhammad Khan Khakwani (in 1758), the Pathan Governor. The Phulhattanwali Mosque in the Chopar Bazar is said to have been built by Emperor Farukh Siyar.

(j) Idgah.

Outside the city about a mile to the north-east is the Idgah which was built by Nawab Abdus Samad Khan, Governor of Lahore, in 1735. It was for sometimes used as the Deputy Commissioner's Kutchery. It is 244 feet long by 54 feet broad and has a central dome with open chambers on either side. Two miles east of the Idgah near the Durana Langana Canal is the Bakirabadi Mosque built by Baqir Khan who was the Subedar of Multan about the year 1720. To the south of Idgah is the shrine of Baba Safra.

(k) Mausoleum of Shah Shams Tabrez.

Close to the shrine of Baba Safra lies the Mausoleum of Shams Tabrez so named after one Shams-ud-Din of Sabzwar in Afghanistan, a descendant of Imam Jafar, who was born in 1165 A.D. This saint is said to have raised from the dead the son of ruler of Ghazni and afterwards came to Multan which at that time was full of holy men, the chief of whom was Bahawal Haq, who is said to have sent a *Lota* full of milk to Shams Tabrez indicating thereby that there was no room for him in the city. Shams Tabrez returned the *Lota* after placing a rose petal in the milk and the delicate reply was appreciated. He is said to have died in 1276 A.D. and the shrine was built by his grandson in 1330 A.D. It was rebuilt by one of his followers in 1718 A.D. The *Sajjada Nashin* of the Mausoleum are Shias.

South of the tomb of Shams Tabrez is the Aam Khas Garden so-called because in the days of Shehzada Murad Bakhsh, son of Shah Jehan, public receptions were held here, private receptions being held in the court.

(l) **Samadh of Diwan Sawan Mal.**

To the east of the tehsil building is the grave of Diwan Sawan Mal. To the south of the railway line about 4 miles from Multan is Suraj Kund, which is connected with the tale of Harnakash.

(m) **Other Shrines.**

On the road from Multan to Suraj Kund is the Chandar Kund or *kacha* tank. Near this

to the west is the mound of Mulla Mauj. Nearer the city on the east of the road is the shrine of Jogmaya which marks the spot where Devi tarried when the gods came down to appease the angry Narsingh. The shrine of Totla Mai is near the Haram Gate inside the city. The shrine of Shah Ali Akbar is in Sura Miani to the north of Multan. The saint was a descendant of Shah Shamsud-Din.

Instructions to the Enumerators.

- Study again the summarized House Numbering Procedure which you received with the list of your duties for the first phase of the Census.
- Read these instructions repeatedly until you are completely familiar with them.
- Study the Dummy interview sheet carefully and see if there are any particular types of houses/households in your block which are not included therein, or if there is any aspect of it which you do not understand, so that you may get your difficulties resolved in the Training Classes.
- Always carry your letter of appointment and introduce yourself by means of it, explaining to each Householder briefly the objects of the Census and the fact that all true information gained in the Census is strictly confidential in respect of all persons and can never be used in any manner against their interests.
- Remember that the "Household" is the smallest unit in the Housing Census and enter the necessary information about each and every Household on a separate line in the Housing Census Schedule.
- Ensure that every Building in your Block has been numbered.
- Carry out completely the Housing Census and Cottage Industry Enquiry. The Housing Census Schedule to be completed in duplicate and only one copy of the Cottage Industry Enquiry Form.
- The entries are required to be made of the total number of each sex regardless of age, who are "normal residents". At this stage no effort will be made to include figures of floating population like visitors to households, homeless folks, etc., Hotels, Serais, Boarding Houses and Hostels will however, report the average number of their total occupants (staff, permanent guests and temporary visitors) as their normal inhabitants. Persons living regularly in Boats, Tents, etc. will be included where they are found.
- Be ready at all times for a visit of inspection by your Circle Supervisor.
- DEFINITIONS**—(a) Household is a collection of persons living and eating in one mess with their dependents, relations, servants and lodgers who normally reside together.

(b) Normal Resident or Usual Inhabitant is a person to whom the house is his or her permanent home or regular lodging place. Floating Population means homeless folks or regular itinerants, visitors to households, etc.

(c) Room is broadly a compartment of House large enough to be slept in.

(d) Cottage Industry: For purposes of this enquiry, a "Cottage Industry" is one which is carried on wholly or mainly with the help of the members of a household working whole-time or part-time on a handicraft or in manufacturing articles of utility, decorative or artistic value for sale mainly outside the village or Mohalla where they are manufactured. This will exclude repair and maintenance services, and will normally exclude village artisans such as the Lohar, Tarkhan, Kumhar, etc., unless they do special work so as to fall within the above definition.

METHOD OF RECORDING PARTICULARS IN THE ENUMERATOR'S REGISTER FOR THE HOUSING CENSUS

1. You have been given two copies of this Register, one of which (Copy No. 1) contains Cottage Industry Schedule which is also to be completed while taking the Housing Census. Even if there is no Cottage Industry in your Block the Cottage Industry Form should still be returned with the word "BLANK" written across it.

2. Your "Location Code" should be completed on each copy of the Housing Census Schedule and on the Cottage Industry Form at home before going out in your Block to fill up the Schedule & Form. This copy of the Housing Census Schedule and the Cottage Industry Form (Copy No. 1) should be completed while out in the Block carrying out the actual Housing Census. The second copy (Copy No. 2) of Housing Census Schedule may be filled up at home by copying out neatly in ink on it each evening the entries you have made on the original (Copy No. 1), during the day.

Column (2) of Housing Census Schedule : The "Census House Number" given to the building or house should be recorded in this column. In a building there can be many houses. In such a case the building number should be recorded first, underneath the No. of the building, the No. of the house therein should be recorded separately. It should be remembered that in case more than one households are living in the same house, the particulars of each of the households will be recorded on a different line by writing "Do" in this column.

Column (3) : Enter the number of one of the eight types of material used in walls and in case where more than one material has been used in different portions of the house, enter the number of the principal material used in outer walls of the Major portion of the house.

Column (4) : Enter the relevant number as in column 3.

Column (5) : If a household is living in a boat or in tent, etc., then put the relevant No. (1, 2 or 3) in this column. Columns (3) & (4) will then be blank.

Column (6) : Give serial number to the households residing in the same house whose particulars are to be recorded on different lines.

Column (7) : If the household is living in "owned", "rented" or "free" house enter the relevant No. (1, 2 or 3) in this Column. In the case of servant quarters, etc., allowed free of rent, write the No. of Free (*i.e.* 3).

Column (8) : Name of the head of the household has to be entered for all occupied houses. For institution, hotel, etc., enter its name. For any unoccupied dwelling write "Vacant Residential" or "Under Construction residential" etc. For non-residential buildings write Mosque, Primary School, Office, Warehouse, Shop, "Vacant Shop" etc., "Under Construction Shop" etc., as the case may be.

Column (9) to (16) : Write the number in the appropriate column.

Column (17) to (18) : For making entries in columns 17 and 18 the head of the household should be specifically asked to state separately the total number of males and females included in the household. This will serve as a check on any possible discrepancy due to the under-reporting of females which must be continually guarded against.

Column (19) : Write the number of rooms occupied by the household (See instruction 10 (c) ante for definition of "room").

Columns (20) to (25) : Write the number in the appropriate column.

Pocket Instructions for Enumerators

General :

1. Read, mark and learn this Booklet so that you may be ready to assist respondents who have any difficulty in choosing their answer.

2. Fill in the Location Code at the top of each schedule at home before you start Enumeration. The following is an example of how these 5 boxes should be filled up by an imaginary Enumerator whose Block Location Code number is 334060312.

3. The remainder of each schedule is to be completed in the field at the actual time of enumeration. Please write clearly and definitely, using your presentation Ball-point pen.

4. Be sure to include all persons enumerated in Cols. 8 to 16 of the Housing Census Schedule who are still present. Also satisfy yourself that all *INFANTS* and all additions made in the household until the time of Enumeration are properly reported. People usually forget to get all the *female members* enumerated, so take special care to see that *every female* in the household is enumerated.

5. Always introduce yourself by showing your letter of Appointment which you should carry with you.

(ii)

6. Should any person object to answering any Census question you should explain that the information collected is **STRICTLY CONFIDENTIAL**, that it will not be communicated to any person whatsoever, and that no use will be made of it, which can in any way injure the respondents interests.

7. Spoiled Schedules should not be removed from the pad, but should be clearly cancelled with a cross on both sides. If a wrong entry is made by mistake under any question, it may be neatly cancelled by a cross (x) and the right entry made.

Whom to Count:

8. The object is to *include in the Census* all persons who are normally residents of Pakistan and all visitors to Pakistan during the Enumeration Period. The Census is to be complete and the motto should be "catch every person", but *no one should be counted more than once*.

9. Therefore *visit each and every house* during the Enumeration Period, missing no place in your Block. Write a schedule for every person you find there who is a Normal Resident, and also for visitors, travellers and wanderers in accordance with these instructions.

10. A Normal Resident in a house is a person who has his or her present regular residence of lodging place there. If you have any doubt as to whether a person is truly a normal resident, you should fill in a schedule for him or her and make a note to consult your Supervisor.

11. Absent members of the household.— The object of the *Preliminary Questions* is to ensure that persons who are temporarily away from their present normal residence for *part*

of the Enumeration Period, are enumerated in the locality in which they normally reside. This will be part of your job.

Persons who are absent from their Normal Residence during the *whole* Enumeration Period will be counted at the place where they have gone and you need not worry about them.

12. Temporary visitors who have not already been enumerated, should be enumerated where they are found no matter where they come from, unless they will be back at their normal place of residence in Pakistan at some later time during the Enumeration Period. If you enumerate them you must warn them not to allow themselves to be enumerated again. But if you do *not* enumerate them you should ask them to get themselves enumerated at their normal place of residence when they return there before 31st January, 1961.

Post Enumeration check:

13. In addition to normal Supervision and Checking during the Enumeration Period, a percentage of the Enumeration Schedules will be completely checked soon after the "BIG COUNT" in order to assess the accuracy of the Census. Every Census Officer should try to ensure that no defect is discovered in his work at that stage.

If a child has not been named enter "Son of———" "Daughter of———". If any person is hesitant to let you know the names of female members of his household, do not insist upon knowing the name but write down "Wife of———", "Daughter of———" and so on. Similarly if the respondent is a woman, do not insist upon knowing the name of her husband or any such person whose name she is reluctant to give in view of any prevailing custom.

Explanation.—Statistically names have no significance and the record of names will

Q. 2. SEX ?

Ring round "male" or "female".

Explanation.—Every person will be classed either as male or female. Eunuchs will be recorded as males.

Q. 3. AGE ?

Write the number of years completed on the 31st January, 1961.

For infants under one year.

Write number of completed months in box "Under one year", i.e., 0 to 11.

Explanation.—Enter age in *completed years*, except for children less than 12 months old *e.g.*, a person who will be 20 years 10 months on 31st January, 1961, should be entered as 20 years and not 21 years. For a child less than 12 months old, enter number of *completed months*. Enter “0” months when under 1 month. If age is not known, try to ascertain the age as accurately as possible by reference to any past event which may be remembered. The estimation of age is of great importance and calls for intelligence and diligence on the part of the Enumerator. It will generally help in the estimation of ages to enumerate the children in a household starting from the youngest child.

Q. 4. MARITAL STATUS?

Single.	Ring round “1” under ‘Single.’
Married.	Ring round “2” under ‘Married’.
Widowed.	Ring round “3” under ‘Widowed.’
Divorced.	Ring round “4” under ‘Divorced’.

Explanation.—“Single” applies only to persons who have never been married.

“Married” includes all persons who are at present married, all persons habitually living together as man and wife and all persons living apart but still married and not widowed or divorced.

“Widowed” applies to a person whose husband or wife is dead, and who has not married again.

“Divorced” applies to both divorcer and divorcee if not remarried.

Q. 5. WERE YOU BORN IN THIS DISTRICT?

If not, WHERE?

If yes, ring round “Born in”.

For other places in Pakistan write name of the District.

If born in “Azad Kashmir” or “Occupied Kashmir” the word “Azad Kashmir” or “Occupied Kashmir” should be written along with the name of District.

If born in India, write “India” along with the name of District.

Elsewhere write name of COUNTRY ONLY.

Explanation.—Birth place means the country or district in which the person was born according to present political boundaries which may differ from those existing at the time of birth.

Q. 6. ARE YOU A PAKISTANI ?

If a Powindah; ask are you an Afghan Powindah?

If a Kashmiri:

Are you a national of “Azad Kashmir” or “Occupied Kashmir”?

If yes, ring round “PAK”.

If yes, write “AFGHAN” and put “Powindah” after it.

Write one of them.

If not what is your NATIONALITY? Write it out.

Explanation.—Write down exactly what the respondent says. People know quite well whether they regard themselves as Pakistani or not and it is their opinion that has to be recorded.

For non-Pakistanis record the name of the country of which they claim to be Nationals.

Afghan Powindahs.—If an Afghan does not know whether he is a Powindah, ask him how long he is staying in Pakistan. If he is only here for the winter, treat him as a Powindah.

Q. 7. RELIGION? Ring round the appropriate number.

Explanation.—Accept respondent's own classification. The last blank box is intended for persons who claim a religion other than those recorded on the schedule, when the religion claimed should be written in the blank box. If a person claims no religion, write "None" in the blank box.

Q. 8. DISABLED? If totally blind, ring round "1" under "Blind".

If deaf and dumb, ring round "2" under "Deaf and Dumb".

If crippled ring round "3" under "Crippled".

Explanation.—A person will be treated as blind if he cannot count the Enumerator's

fingers held up about or ~~in~~ in front of his face with or without spectacles, and as "Crippled" if he is permanently unable to use one or both of his arms and or legs. A person who is deaf but *can* speak, or dumb but *can* hear will *not* be counted as "deaf and dumb".

IF NOT DISABLED PUT A CROSS IN THIS BOX

Q. 9. MOTHER TONGUE? Ring round the appropriate number under languages.

Explanation.—One of the last blank columns is intended for persons whose mother tongue is not one of those named on the schedule; when that is the case write the name of the language in the blank heading and then ring the number underneath. Every person must have a mother tongue. In the case of a young child who is as yet unable to speak, or of a deaf-mute, the language to be entered would be that principally spoken at the present time in the home by the parents or guardians. A person cannot have more than one mother tongue and for this reason there should be *only one* entry in this column.

Q. 10. OTHER LANGUAGES YOU CAN EASILY SPEAK? Ring round the appropriate number under languages.

Explanation.—The respondent should not claim to speak any language unless he can easily converse in it. If he claims to be able to speak languages which are not provided on the schedule write the names in the blank columns and ring the number in the appropriate box. The language already ringed as mother tongue in the preceding question should *NOT* be ringed again in this question which deals only with *OTHER* languages spoken.

Q. 11. LITERACY?

(i) Are you able to read and write a simple letter? If so, in what languages?

Ring round the number under appropriate languages against "Write and Read only".

(ii) Are you able to read with understanding, but not write? If so, in what languages?

Ring round the number under appropriate languages against "Read only".

(iii) Are you able to read the Holy Quran without understanding?

If yes, put a \checkmark mark under Arabic in box 9 against "Read only."

IF CANNOT READ OR WRITE AT ALL DRAW A CROSS RIGHT THROUGH THESE BOXES.

Explanation.—A ring round 9 under Arabic against "Read only" will mean that the respondent can read Arabic and the Holy Quran with understanding. A \checkmark in this box will clearly mean ability only to read the Holy Quran without understanding. Languages already ringed for "Write and Read" should not be ringed again for "Read only".

Q. 12. SCHOOL OR COLLEGE ATTENDANCE?

Are you NOW ATTENDING A SCHOOL OR COLLEGE OR AN INSTITUTE OF EDUCATION?

If attending a school or college of General or Professional Education ring round "G". If attending an Institution of

Technical Education ring round "T".

If attending a Maktab ring round "M".

IF A PERSON IS NOT AT PRESENT ATTENDING ANY SCHOOL OR COLLEGE, PUT A CROSS IN THE BOX "NOW GOING TO SCHOOL OR COLLEGE."

Explanation.—For the purpose of Census a person is regarded as regularly attending school or college, or a technical institution regardless of any temporary break in attendance due to sickness or holiday, etc. The terms "School" and "College" cover institutions imparting General or Professional Education below and above matriculation standard respectively without regard to the names of the institutions.

Technical Institutions include Polytechnics, Technical High Schools, etc.

Maktab or Madrasa includes places where the Holy Quran and often elementary Urdu or other local languages are taught by an Imam, Maulvi or other teacher.

Certificates will not be recorded if general education has not passed "middle" or the 8th class.

Q. 14. OWNERS OF AGRICULTURAL LAND. DO YOU OWN AGRICULTURAL LAND IN PAKISTAN?

Ring round "Yes" or "No" as appropriate.

Explanation.—(1) Agricultural land includes land producing crops and also banjar. It excludes building sites and land reserved for residential purposes such as 'Abadideh'.

(2) Owner of Agricultural land includes one shown as such in the Revenue records (khewat or khata). But it also includes Lease purchasers, Mortgagees with possession, Refugees and other persons who have been given provisional or permanent allotment of Agricultural land and Grantees of land in Colonies on instalment payment or other bases (including those who became owners after Land Reforms).

(3) Owner excludes those who are mortgagees without possession and adult sons of landowners who work their parents' land, with or without their own ploughs. It excludes also all occupancy and other tenants and share croppers.

REMAINING QUESTIONS ARE TO BE ASKED ONLY OF PERSONS TEN (10) YEARS OLD AND ABOVE.

Q. 15. ECONOMICALLY ACTIVE UN-EMPLOYED AND INACTIVE.

Are you WORKING FOR PROFIT or to EARN WAGES or SALARY or do you

If "Yes", ring round (1).

HELP ANY MEMBER OF YOUR FAMILY ON THE FARM, ETC.?

If not working at present, are you LOOKING FOR WORK for salary or wages or profit, etc.

If "yes", ring round (2).

If "No", ring round (1).

Explanation.—(1) not a tiller of the soil, this question should be put with specific reference to "WORKING" or "NOT WORKING BUT LOOKING FOR WORK" during the last week, i.e., a non-agricultural worker who has not been working, but looking for work during the last week will be ringed "2", but if he has done any work for profit, etc., during the week, he will be ringed "1".

(2) "Inactive" is a person who is not working to earn his livelihood nor is he in search of any work. Students and Housewives doing only household duties are to be treated as "Inactive". But persons who are helping any member of their family in his profession or trade, even if they are not paid for such work in cash or kind, are to be classed as "Working". Persons not working and living on rent or pension only are also to be treated as inactives. Beggars and Prostitutes are also to be classed as inactives, because, although they do earn, they are not helping in the production of economic goods.

(3) In the case of "Inactives" questions 16 to 20 will not be asked but the details of their categories will be ascertained from Question No. 21 and recorded accordingly.

Questions 16 to 20 to be asked only of persons who are "WORKING" OR "LOOKING FOR WORK", i.e., who are ringed (1) or (2) in Q. No. 15.

Q. 16. WHAT IS YOUR MAIN OCCUPATION?

(what kind of work do you do)?

If a **TILLER OF THE SOIL**, ring round "T" and move on to Q. 18. Otherwise write the **OCCUPATION**.

Explanation.—A tiller of the soil is one who himself works on the land or gets it cultivated under his direct personal supervision. Information regarding "Main Occupation" is required only if the person is "WORKING" or, if not working is "LOOKING FOR WORK". It is essential that a person's occupation be recorded in such a way that it may provide an adequate description of the work he is doing, or is looking for. In the case of a person looking for work for the first time, enter "NONE YET".

For your guidance a list of descriptions of occupations which are not acceptable without qualification is given below. This list is not comprehensive but gives an idea of the precision required.

Administrative Officer.—State whether Government Administrative, City Council Administrative Officer, etc.

Clerk.—State whether accounts clerk, correspondence clerk, stores clerk, solicitor's clerk, tally clerk, timekeeper, etc.

Driver.—State whether lorry driver, bus driver, taxi driver, car driver, tractor driver, railway engine driver, crane driver, bulldozer driver, etc.

Conductor.—State whether bus conductor, band conductor, railway conductor, etc.

Engineer.—State whether civil engineer, electrical engineer, mechanical engineer, mining engineer, motor engineer, etc.

Factory Worker.—State the exact nature of work done and the kind of factory.

Inspector.—State whether fire inspector, health inspector, labour inspector, police inspector, traffic inspector, ticket inspector, railway inspector, vehicle inspector, etc.

Labourer.—State whether dock labourer, earth moving labourer, godown labourer, transport labourer, etc.

Manager.—State whether finance manager, personnel manager, general sales manager, textile retail manager, owner or partner (stating nature of business), etc.

Mechanic.—State whether motor mechanic, radio mechanic, lift mechanic, etc.

Owner Proprietor.—State nature of business owned.

Salesman.—State whether retail shop salesman, insurance salesman, ticket salesman, newsboy, street vendor, wholesale commodities salesman, broker, auctioneer, etc.

The description should be appropriate to the actual work done irrespective of educational, professional, or technical qualifications achieved by a person. Vague, incomplete and ambiguous descriptions like "service" "Labourer" "Mulazmat" should be avoided.

For PERSONS NOT RINGED "T" IN QUESTION NO. 16.

Q. 17. NAME AND TYPE OF INDUSTRY, BUSINESS OR SERVICE? Write it out.

Explanation.—Enter the name of the Industry, Business or Service in which the person is working.

(xii)

The entry has to be made *only* if the person is working, or if not working, has been previously working and is at present looking for work. In the case of a person who is looking for work for the first time, enter "X" against this question.

Industry refers to the activity of the firm, establishment or department in which the person is employed or to the kind of business the person operates. The following are examples of Industry/Business descriptions:—

Stock-raising, forestry and logging, fishery, biscuit making, clothes making, furniture making, brick manufacturing, pineapple canning, cotton ginning, cotton textiles, jute textiles, woollen textiles, tannery, leather products, blacksmithy, motor repairing, road making, fish retailing, boot and shoe retailing, banking, insurance, architecture, advertising, cinema, restaurants, hotels, laundries, hair-dressing, etc.

Railway transport, motor taxi service, motor cycle rikshaw service, air transport, postal services, primary school, technical school, university, Governmental medical services, private medical services, social welfare services, legal services, domestic services, armed services, etc.

The list is not comprehensive but it should indicate the variety of descriptions and the degree of precision required.

Q. 18. AGRICULTURAL STATUS? Only for persons ringed "T" in question No. 16.

(i) Do you OWN ALL OR PART OF THE LAND you till? If yes, ring round "1" under "owner cultivator".

(ii) TENANT— Do you pay rent in cash or kind for ALL OR PART OF the land you till? If yes, ring round "2" under "Tenant".

(iii) Are you UNPAID FAMILY HELP? If yes, ring round "3" under "Family help".

(iv) Are you an AGRICULTURAL LABOURER working for others for wages in cash or kind? If yes, ring round "4" under "Agricultural Labour".

Explanation.— persons classed as Tillers in Q. 16 mu have a ring round one or more of the number in this question. For instance a man who is a little land which he cultivates himself, who also has some land on rent, and who in his spare time works for reward in agriculture for others, will have rings round numbers 1, 2 and 4.

Q. 19. STATUS IN BUSINESS, TRADE, INDUSTRY OR SERVICE? For persons Not ringed "T" in question 16.

(i) In your main occupation do you EMPLOY OTHERS? If yes, ring round "1" under "Employer".

- (ii) or Are you an EMPLOYEE? If yes, ring round "2" under "Employee".
- (iii) or An INDEPENDENT worker? If yes, ring round "3" under "Independent worker".
- (iv) or UNPAID FAMILY HELP? If yes, ring round "4" under "Unpaid family help".

Explanation.—Every non-agriculturist who is economically active must be classified under one and *only one* of the above categories.

Note that the whole question concerns the main occupation given in question No. 16. Persons who employ others in their profession or business will be classed as "Employer". No one will be classed as "Employer" merely because he employs domestic servants. For example, a cook is classed as an employee in his occupation, but if he is cooking for, let us say, a civil servant, the latter will *not* be shown as an employee in that account. Similarly a Company Director for instance, although he may have power to appoint and discharge Company staff will not be classed as "Employer", because he himself is an employee of the Company. An independent worker is his own employer in his trade or business who does not employ others. An unpaid family help is a member of the family who assists directly in the trade or business of another member but receives no separate payment in cash or kind.

Q. 20. HAVE YOU ANY SUBSIDIARY MEANS OF LIVELIHOOD? IF SO, WHAT? Write it out.

IF A PERSON HAS NO SUBSIDIARY OCCUPATION, PUT A CROSS IN THE BOX.

Explanation.—Enter the name of Subsidiary Occupation in full, or at least, in sufficient detail to ensure identification from the Main Occupation.

In order to claim "Subsidiary Occupation", a person must be following two occupations, the second being pursued in addition to or alternatively to the "Main Occupation".

This must be either a secondary source of income pursued throughout the whole year or an alternative means of livelihood adopted at times when the main occupation cannot be followed. This distinction, however, need not be recorded, and it is only necessary for the Enumerator to say what, if any, is the secondary or alternative means of livelihood of the respondent.

In rural areas the Subsidiary Occupation (if any) of cultivators will generally be one of the agricultural occupations such as poultry, bee-keeping, etc., or a cottage industry. Service on roads or in the militia may be a normal subsidiary occupation in some areas. When Cottage Industries are given as subsidiary occupation, they should be described as "Home weaving", "Home pottery making", "Home mat making", etc.

Q. 21. DETAILS OF INACTIVES?

Only those persons who are ringed as "3" in question No. 15 should be asked: Ring round number "1".

- (i) Do you work as HOUSE WIFE, *i.e.*, perform household duties only?

- (ii) Do you receive any kind of RENT, PENSION, etc.?

Ring round number "2".

(iii) Are you an INMATE OF MENTAL ASYLUM, JAIL or other such Institution or are you a beggar? Ring round number "3".

(iv) DEPENDENT and others. Ring round number "4".

Explanation.—More than one of the numbers in this Question may have to be ringed.

Q. 22. ONLY FOR WOMEN WHO ARE OR HAVE BEEN MARRIED?

(i) *During your whole married life:*

How many CHILDREN have been born ALIVE altogether?

Write under "Children born" total number of children born alive to her.

(ii) *During your whole life:*

How many years you REMAINED MARRIED altogether?

Write under "Years Wed" total number of years.

Explanation.—Include any infant born alive who may have died since.

If a woman has been married more than once the two questions should cover the whole period she remained married from the date

of her first marriage. For example a woman married for the first time and after 5 years was divorced. Some years later she remarried and her (new) husband died 10 years later, since when she has remained a widow. In this case "Total years remained wed" is $5+10=15$ years.

After filling up a Schedule for each member of the household, you should check again that no one in the household (particularly daughters-in-law) has been over-looked. Also that no one normally resident in the household is temporarily absent and expected back before the 31st of January 1961.

Progress Reports:

Carry out the enumeration of your area progressively every day. Don't leave the work to be done towards the end of the Enumeration Period. In order to ensure this, report regularly to your Supervisor in the prescribed forms regarding the percentage of the work completed on the dates shown in the Calendar. The first round of your visits to all the houses in your Block should be completed during the 1st two weeks. Then during the next three days carry out a 2nd round and enumerate the Households that might have been left out during the 1st round, and also those normal residents who were temporarily absent, but have since returned and have not been enumerated elsewhere. Two days before the last date (*i.e.*, 29th January 1961) make an announcement in your Block that persons left out may kindly report to you at an agreed place and get themselves enumerated. Continue the checking for omissions during the last two days and then on the actual Census Night (Night of the 31st January) you must make a rapid and thorough examination of the whole Block. All new arrivals, travellers, wanderers,

Q. 16. WHAT IS YOUR MAIN OCCUPATION?

(what kind of work do you do)?

If a **TILLER OF THE SOIL**, ring round "T" and move on to Q. 18. Otherwise write the **OCCUPATION**.

Explanation.—A tiller of the soil is one who himself works on the land or gets it cultivated under his direct personal supervision. Information regarding "Main Occupation" is required only if the person is "WORKING" or, if not working is "LOOKING FOR WORK". It is essential that a person's occupation be recorded in such a way that it may provide an adequate description of the work he is doing, or is looking for. In the case of a person looking for work for the first time, enter "NONE YET".

For your guidance a list of descriptions of occupations which are not acceptable without qualification is given below. This list is not comprehensive but gives an idea of the precision required.

Administrative Officer.—State whether Government Administrative, City Council Administrative Officer, etc.

Clerk.—State whether accounts clerk, correspondence clerk, stores clerk, solicitor's clerk, tally clerk, timekeeper, etc.

Driver.—State whether lorry driver, bus driver, taxi driver, car driver, tractor driver, railway engine driver, crane driver, bulldozer driver, etc.

Conductor.—State whether bus conductor, band conductor, railway conductor, etc.

Engineer.—State whether civil engineer, electrical engineer, mechanical engineer, mining engineer, motor engineer, etc.

Factory Worker.—State the exact nature of work done and the kind of factory.

Inspector.—State whether fire inspector, health inspector, labour inspector, police inspector, traffic inspector, ticket inspector, railway inspector, vehicle inspector, etc.

Labourer.—State whether dock labourer, earth moving labourer, godown labourer, transport labourer, etc.

Manager.—State whether finance manager, personnel manager, general sales manager, textile retail manager, owner or partner (stating nature of business), etc.

Mechanic.—State whether motor mechanic, radio mechanic, lift mechanic, etc.

Owner Proprietor.—State nature of business owned.

Salesman.—State whether retail shop salesman, insurance salesman, ticket salesman, newsboy, street vendor, wholesale commodities salesman, broker, auctioneer, etc.

The description should be appropriate to the actual work done irrespective of educational, professional, or technical qualifications achieved by a person. Vague, incomplete and ambiguous descriptions like "service" "Labourer" "Mulazmat" should be avoided.

For PERSONS NOT RINGED "T" IN QUESTION NO. 16.

Q. 17. NAME AND TYPE OF INDUSTRY, BUSINESS OR SERVICE? Write it out.

Explanation.—Enter the name of the Industry, Business or Service in which the person is working.

homeless folk and others who are found then anywhere within your area must be questioned and, if they have not been enumerated before, a slip must be prepared for each of them.

The End of the Work :

When you are sure that you have properly enumerated every person in your Block, and your last check-up has been completed as above, you should recount all your valid schedules in each Pad and check the totals which you will have recorded on the back covers thereof, showing males, females and literate persons separately. These totals on the back covers should then be added up and the grand totals recorded in your Report Sheet reproduced as a detachable form at the end of this Booklet. This Report Sheet should then be removed and handed over to your Supervisor along with the used and partially used pads of Schedules and the Supervisors receipt should be obtained in the form below:

Copy No. 1 of the Housing Census Register should also be handed over to the Supervisor at this time which should be before 3rd February 1961.

INTRODUCTION

The village is the basic unit of revenue administration and the need for basic statistics for villages is quite obvious as all planning depends on such statistics. They are also indispensable for carrying out sample surveys over limited areas and form the basis of continuous collection of statistics on different aspects of rural life and economy. The village was taken as the basic unit of enumeration if its population was 600 or it was a continuous collection of about 150 houses on an average. Where the village approximated to this size, it was constituted into a Block. A large number of villages had to be split up into a number of Blocks, but the boundaries of Census Block did not go beyond the limits of a revenue estate. All statistics pertaining to a village concerning land administration are given by "Mauza" or revenue estate and the importance of this territorial unit in our administrative set-up is unique. A "Mauza" may be defined as a parcel or parcels of land having a separate name in the revenue records and known limits. The unit of revenue administration is the revenue estate or "deh" which is usually identical with the village or "mauza". A revenue estate is a unit of area—

- (a) for which a separate record-of-rights has been made, or
- (b) which has been separately assessed to land revenue or would have been so assessed, if the land revenue had not been leased, compounded for, or redeemed, or
- (c) which the Local Government may by general rule or special order declare it to be an estate.

The Village Statistics contained in this part have been compiled from Block-wise figures contained in the Summaries prepared by the Census Supervisors and Charge Superintendents. Except for data on houses and households they are based on the results of the "Circle Sort" which was carried out in the Hand Sorting Centres after the physical counting of the individual enumeration schedules. The literacy figures, however, have been lifted from the Summaries prepared by the Supervisors and Charge Superintendents.

The plan of presentation is that for each village, the Hadbast number, its name in English and Urdu and area in acres, the total population by males and females, and the number of literates in each village has been recorded.

The last two columns pertain to number of houses and households. This information is based on the Housing Census which was carried out in September, 1960. The data was collected in the first instance from the Summaries prepared after the Housing Census by the Charge Superintendents. These figures have been checked with the results of the Machine tabulation in the case of urban localities, but since only 10 per cent sample was taken for the villages, the data of villages has been extracted directly from the Household Summaries. The number of houses refers only to the "occupied" houses, while the number of households refers to the community unit the members of which live together and eat from a common kitchen. The definitions of "houses" and "households" are given in the Explanatory Note.

(ii)

The "Hadbast" numbers are the numbers assigned to a revenue estate at the time of the settlement operations. They are allotted serially within the tehsil at the time of settlement. Hence the arrangement of villages in each tehsil does not follow the serial order of Hadbast numbers, but within each Patwar Circle they have been arranged serially. Where no survey and settlement operations have been carried out, this column is left blank. The area figures have been supplied by the Deputy Commissioners and are based on revenue records. Local details regarding Schools, Colleges, Post Offices, Telegraph Offices, Railway Stations, Police Stations, Rest Houses, Union Council Offices, Hospitals, Dispensaries, Electricity, Tubewells, etc., have been indicated by appropriate symbols against each village. A list of these symbols is appended. These details have been obtained from Deputy Commissioners and from the concerned Departments. The data has been presented by tehsils within each district. In each tehsil, the villages have been grouped by Field Qanungo Circles and within each Field Qanungo Circle

by Patwar Circles. The name of the Field Qanungo Circle has been separated from the text by double lines and the village in which the Patwari's headquarter is located is shown in bold print.

The Village Statistics for this district were compiled in the Hand Sorting Centre, Multan under the supervision of Mr. A. Hamid Deputy Director of Census, Incharge of Hand Sorting Centre, Multan. After compilation, the lists were sent by the Officer-in-Charge, Hand Sorting Centre, to the Deputy Commissioner concerned for verification and completion of figures relating to "Hadbast" numbers, area and local details. After this verification, the Village Statistics were sent to my office, where they were further checked, adjusted and consolidated before publication.

A summary giving the total population of the district and distribution by sexes to the nearest thousand has been given in the beginning. Similar summaries by tehsils and by Field Qanungo Circles within each tehsil have also been added.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

1. Population in the Village Statistics includes persons who claimed nationality other than Pakistani.

2. Tehsil figures include those of urban areas within its jurisdiction.

3. Figures for Municipal and Town Committees as well as other urban localities are given separately under respective Tehsils within which they are located.
















4. Household is a collection of persons living and eating in one mess with their dependents, relatives, servants and lodgers who normally reside together.

5. House is a structurally separate set of living premises, with an entrance from outside the building or from a common half way or courtyard or staircase.

6. Number of literate figures have been taken from Charge Superintendents Abstracts (Provisional results of Census published in February 1961). These may not tally with the final figures published in Part IV of District Census Report.

7. Urban Localities are grouped separately at the top of the Village Statistics of each Tehsil. The areas of Urban localities and their Hadbast numbers, being not available, have not been shown separately.
