Resource Mobilization Department is working to develop public awareness plans for GET. It designs and executes volunteer management system, fund raising campaigns and relationship with individuals as well as with corporate donors. RMD also prepares proposals, appeals, and reports in order to provide constant feed back to the donors.

Under RMD three desks are working:

- 1. Orphan/ Needy Support Program (OSP)
- 2. School Adoption Program (SAP)
- 3. Media Cell

1. Orphan/ Needy Support Programme (OSP)

Education is the knowledge of putting one's potential to its best use. It is an admitted fact that education brightens and enhances the abilities of human beings. According to a recent study, 46% of Pakistani schoolgoing students have to discontinue their education before grade V due to unfavorable economic conditions. In such a depressing situation, OSP welcomes the deserving & needy students from every part of the country. Though there is a permanent provision of five needy & orphan students in each class in every GET school, but we have opened the school doors for every student and made it compulsory to accommodate, facilitate &

educate the needy students. In this way, about 50% of the total students are benefitting from this sponsorship scheme.


Working with Orphan/Needy Support Programme in Pakistan, we are surprised at how fast their number is growing. There is an addition 14000 orphan /needy in our schools since 1997. Right now, 16600 deserving students are getting free quality education in GET schools. Sponsorship funds provide the child with textbooks, uniforms, school supplies, and tutors, as needed throughout the year. We have increased annual scholarship from 13,483,604 to 16,919,376 (almost 22% increase). Now we are able to provide the education facilities to deserving students in a better way.



Parent Teacher Meeting

Students learning and development depends on parent, teachers and school management. If the coordination among these three is firm and strong no one can deny a successful future of our students.

Alhamdulillah parents are integral part of GET's school system from the very begging. Therefore, formally Ghazali Education Trust manages to arrange parent teacher meeting after every three months in all schools at village level. PTM are helpful to prepare new academic plans for the students after detail discussions from both sides. Every teacher prepares progress report of students in his/her class to update their children progress. Students' performances are evaluated in these meetings. These performance reports explain about student's interest in studies, curricular and co-curricular activities, hobbies, home work, class work, uniform and discipline in school etc. Every student is accesses after observation in above mentioned areas and share it with their parents. Parents are strongly encouraged to discuss school activities of their children with teachers and school management. Parent's deep concern and participation in PTM shows their trust in GET schools. It is observed in these PTM participations of mother is overwhelming.

Local School Committee

GET in its formation years evolved and developed the concept of local participation in term of Local School committee (LSC) in every school established by GET. GET is capable to sustain its whole programme with the active involvement of local communities. The concept of Local School Committee (LSC) is simple and workable. GET district management team select 5 to 7 well-known personalities from the village with the mutual consent of all stakeholders for two years. These people are called member of local school committee, and committee is responsible to oversee all matters related to school management. The LSC is headed by District Manager schools and meetings are held after every three months. LSC members express their views without any hesitation, constructive and positive decisions are made with the mutual coordination of members for the betterment of school. Every member has equal rights and responsibilities. Now LSC is also involved to generate funds to meet the school's requirement. In year 2008 614 LSC meeting were held in GET schools and 3684 members of LSC participated.

Quran Classes

So many education systems are working in Pakistan. But Alhamdulillah GET feels proud that along with quality education students' character building is emphasized. Being Muslim non government organization (NGO) GET believes that teaching of Quran is a real source of inspiration for a character blinding of students and teachers. Quranic Education is necessarily included in curriculum of GET schools, so that students may read and understand Quran with its accurate accent. From the very beg gaining of their academic carrier students start reading Holy Quran, and by the time they are in grade 5 they can read it thoroughly.

GET also arrange Quran Classes for local communities, students and teachers. Teachers and other mudarseen explain Holy Quran and Sunnah of Prophet (PBUH) in simple and understandable manners. These Quran classes are highly admired by students, teachers, parents and local communities. Not only students, even teachers are feeling visible change in their personalities. Teachers' training is provided by head office for the preparation of Quran classes on regular bases. 3319 Quran classes were arranged in year 2008.



Over 20000 boys and girls lost their lives under the wreckage of their schools and colleges. Mothers lost their children and the nation got a big devastation. Humanitarian organizations came into movement and started working in earth quack-hit areas. 
