Message from President

Education is brought under discussion on each and every forum in Pakistan. Different platforms organize seminars, symposiums and arrange conferences after that, direct actions and coalitions are convened and resolutions are adopted. But as a matter of fact, it is unfortunate that policies and actions taken at the state level are not at all satisfactory, or result oriented and do not meet the minimum requirements for combating the educational crisis that Pakistan is confronting since many decades.

Ghazali Education Trust has bloomed into its 15th year and is certainly mature enough in the field of education. Ghazali's efforts in providing quality education to rural areas of Pakistan are although commendable but on the broader canvas these would apparently be a drop of water in proportion to the ocean of illiteracy and ignorance. The government is lacking the vision, strategy, determination and stability required to resolve the colossal educational challenge. Despite this gloomy picture, we must acknowledge the excellent endeavors in the field of education by private sector, social organizations and patriot Pakistanis. These efforts are surely needed to be praised and appreciated for being a source of encouragement among Pakistanis for a successful future in the field of education.

Today, Ghazali Education Trust remained firmly committed to the cause of educating deprived children in the rural areas. We started our mission in 1997 with the limited financial and human resources at GET's disposal. We might not be able to resolve the huge educational challenges but on account of these efforts a vast awareness about accountability of state institutions has developed among the masses. A consensus, it has developed among people that the government must put to right track its envisioned priorities and provide adequate resources to the education sector in Pakistan.

Ghazali Education Trust, with a very humble launch in 1997, is now crossing the provincial boundaries. After stabilized its network in Punjab and Khyber Pakhtunkhawa, its next stop over is Baluchistan; the biggest province of Pakistan, neglected and deprived despite all its natural resources. With the help of Allah (SWT), the cooperation of philanthropist Pakistanis and the determined field workers, Ghazali will succeed, Inshallah, in expanding the bright horizon in the darkness of ignorance.

The unfortunate condition of education sector in Pakistan is pathetic, whereas the situation in the rural areas is worse even. Since GET is committed to spread light of knowledge in each and every village of Pakistan, the main task of RMD is to develop awareness among Pakistanis about GET activities and seeking their support for providing educational facilities for the deprived, needy, deserving and brilliant students. Therefore, RMD keeps itself in constant touch with the donors at home and abroad. With the expanding network of GET schools and enrollment, the financial needs also multiply every year. To make sure that not a single orphan, needy and deprived,

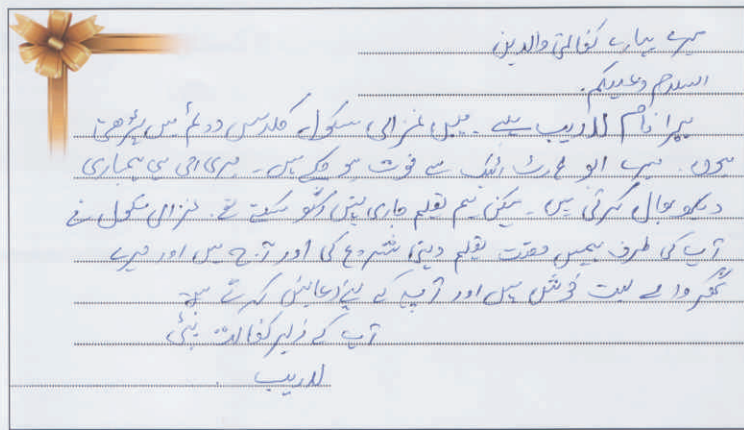
deserving student is left without quality education due to lack of financial support; RMD is running the following programs besides fund raising campaigns:

i) ORPHAN/NEEDY SUPPORT PROGRAM (OSP):

Education plays a pivotal role in the development of a country and as a result of which a prosperous society takes shape. Although access to education is among the basic rights of every citizen but the education facilities in Pakistan, especially in the rural areas are negligible and this is the place where GET enters into the field to fill in the vacuum. According to a survey 42% of school going children discontinue their education and do not go beyond grade V due to unfavourable

economic conditions as well as lack of adequate educational facilities. In such a situation GET intends to embrace orphan/needy students from every nick and corner of rural Pakistan. The number of such students is surprisingly on the increase every year.

Achievements: During the year under review, a total number of 18344 orphan/needy students were getting quality education at GET schools which is almost 50% of its enrollment while during 2008 the figure of such students was 16600. These students are provided free of cost tuition, textbooks, uniforms, school accessories, etc. GET takes pride in sharing that the scholarship amount for these students has been increased from Pk. Rs. 16.9 million in 2008 to Pk. Rs.27.4 million during the year under review; an increase of 62%. With this substantial increase GET was able to provide even better educational facilities to its orphan/needy students.

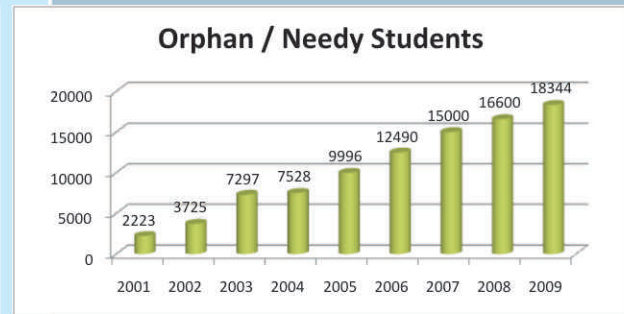
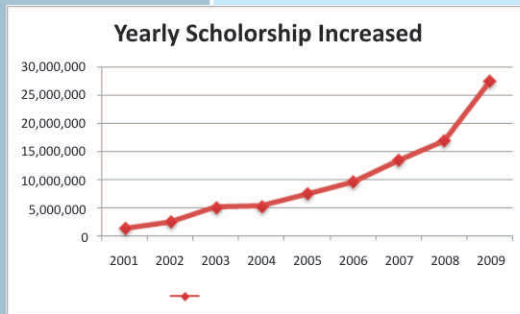

i) Gift by Dar-e-Arqam School Children:

ii) Eid Gifts for Poor Families:

As a symbol of love and brotherhood, 293 families of the orphan/needy students in 5 Districts were presented food packages at the auspicious occasion of Eid. 'Helping Hand USA' took keen interest in this project and this gesture was overwhelmingly appreciated and praised among the rural society and thus



creating a sense of trust among GET, donor, concerned families and the society.

iv) Seasonal Project

With its track record of working with the rural society, GET enjoys its confidence because its deep understanding of local culture and tradition. During the last Holy Month of Ramadan, GET presented 'Aftar Packages' within 15 Districts to 3000 persons. This project was successfully completed with the kind collaboration of Sheikh Zayed Al-Nahyan Foundation and Al-Islah Society. On behalf of the families who got benefitted from this project, GET takes this opportunity to express its thanks to the donors.



v) Clean Water Project:

A vast majority of Pakistanis have no access to clean water which leads to wide range of diseases. The provision of clean drinking water is even scarce in the rural areas all over Pakistan. With the generous help and co-operation of 'Prem Rawat Foundation (USA)' GET provided clean and cold drinking water facility to 60 GET schools. Almost 20,000 people of the local community, besides students, are benefitting from this project. GET has an expansion plan to extend this facility to more schools in the coming years.



vi) Ghazali Forums:

Ghazali Media Cell invited distinguished personalities to deliver lectures to the Ghazali staff members and volunteers covering a range of social, cultural and international issues on quarterly basis. These lectures keep the staff & volunteers aware of the latest developments in the field of education, management, social work, politics, art and culture, thus strengthening and updating their knowledge to improve the work performance.



vii) Ghazali Newsletter:

Ghazali Newsletter is a source of promoting and sharing the latest GET activities with its donors, institutions, well wishers and general public. The newsletter is published and circulated at home and abroad on quarterly basis.



viii) Teachers' Day:

To commemorate the teachers' services in the field of education World Teachers' Day is celebrated throughout the world every year on 5th October, since its inception in 1994. On this occasion, GET organized 'Teachers' Day Programs' at District and School level. A great number of students, teachers, civil society representatives and dignitaries participated in these programs. A 'walk' was also organized to honor the teachers for their contribution and services for educating the young generation. Major move was held in Islamabad.

(PREP) Pakistan Rural Education Program

Pakistan Rural Education Program (PREP):

PREP administers the working of schools through various parameters. This department scrutinizes the curricular and co-curricular activities of the students. It examines the sustainability of a school by analyzing the results of exams conducted, the number of students enrolled and the expectations of parents fulfilled.



It also aims at improving the moral conduct of the students along with the provision of quality education. This makes GET a distinguished institute among others.

PREP also focuses on diminishing the gulf between the educational facilities provided in the urban and rural areas elevating the standard of academic institutes in the countryside. In this way GET contributed a lot in raising the literacy rate in the rural areas. A team of 28 managers of PREP field force used to remain in the circle making surprise and scheduled school visits.

GET students win colours:

GET believes that extra and co-curricular activities should be promoted among children because they enhance physical and mental capabilities and encourage students to get through educational career. It is an integral part of GET's training program. GET schools actively took part in literary competition program announced by the Punjab Government. Faiqa Rehman, a young girl of the 5th class at GET School Safdarabad, got first position in Urdu speech contest whereas Mehran Saleem stood first in the English Speech Competition. The program was held at

to become useful citizens. With the kind co-operation of Ameen Maktab and Punjab Trust for Disable Children GET started a pilot project to provide education to these children in order to give them their due place in the society so that instead of relying on others' they can find their own way to demonstrate their skills. In this regard, the dedicated workers of GET and Ameen Maktab are busy to train and educate special children studying in the schools of district Lahore and Sheikhpura. The Ameen Maktab has arranged a dedicated team of psychologists that trains the GET teachers and pays a visit to these schools twice a week so as to understand and solve the problems of these

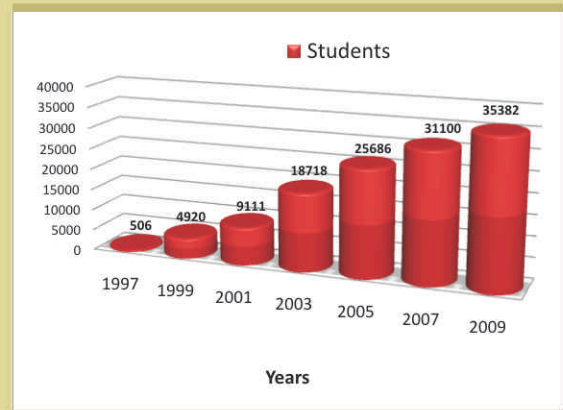
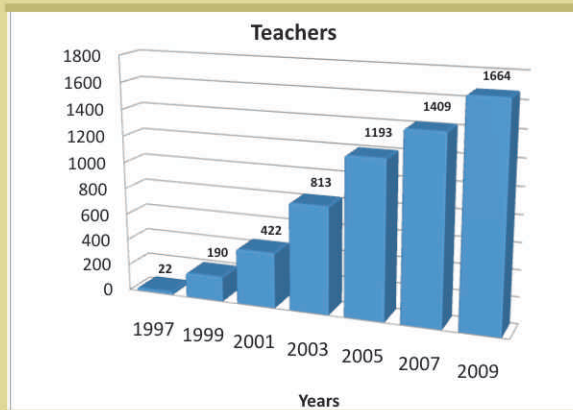
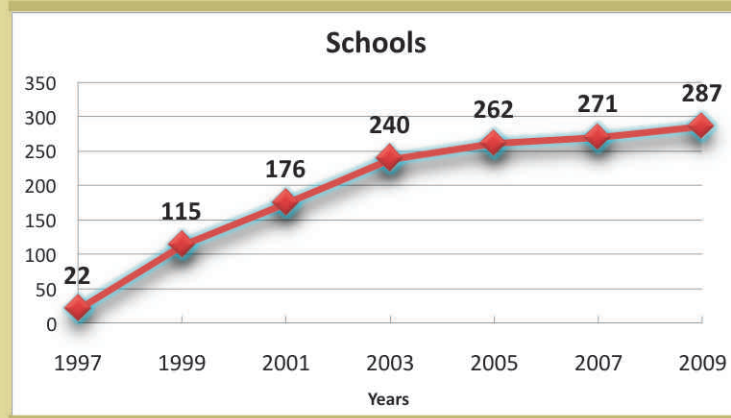

Physically or mentally retarded children are also a part of our society but it has been observed that due to various social, economical and psychological reasons, they suffer from inferiority complex and are unable

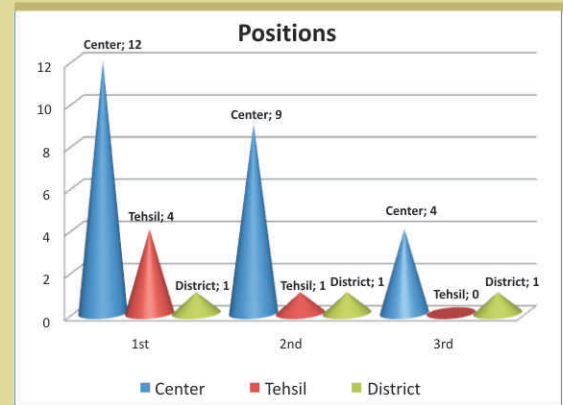
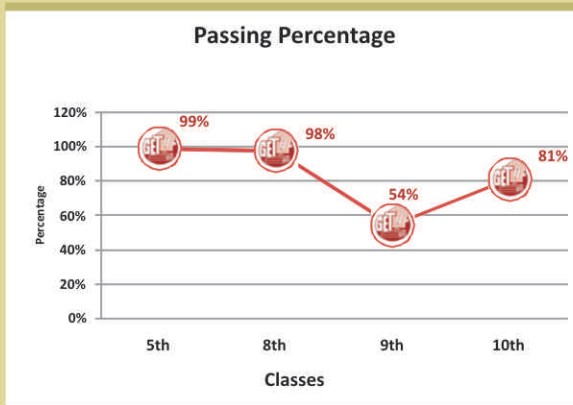

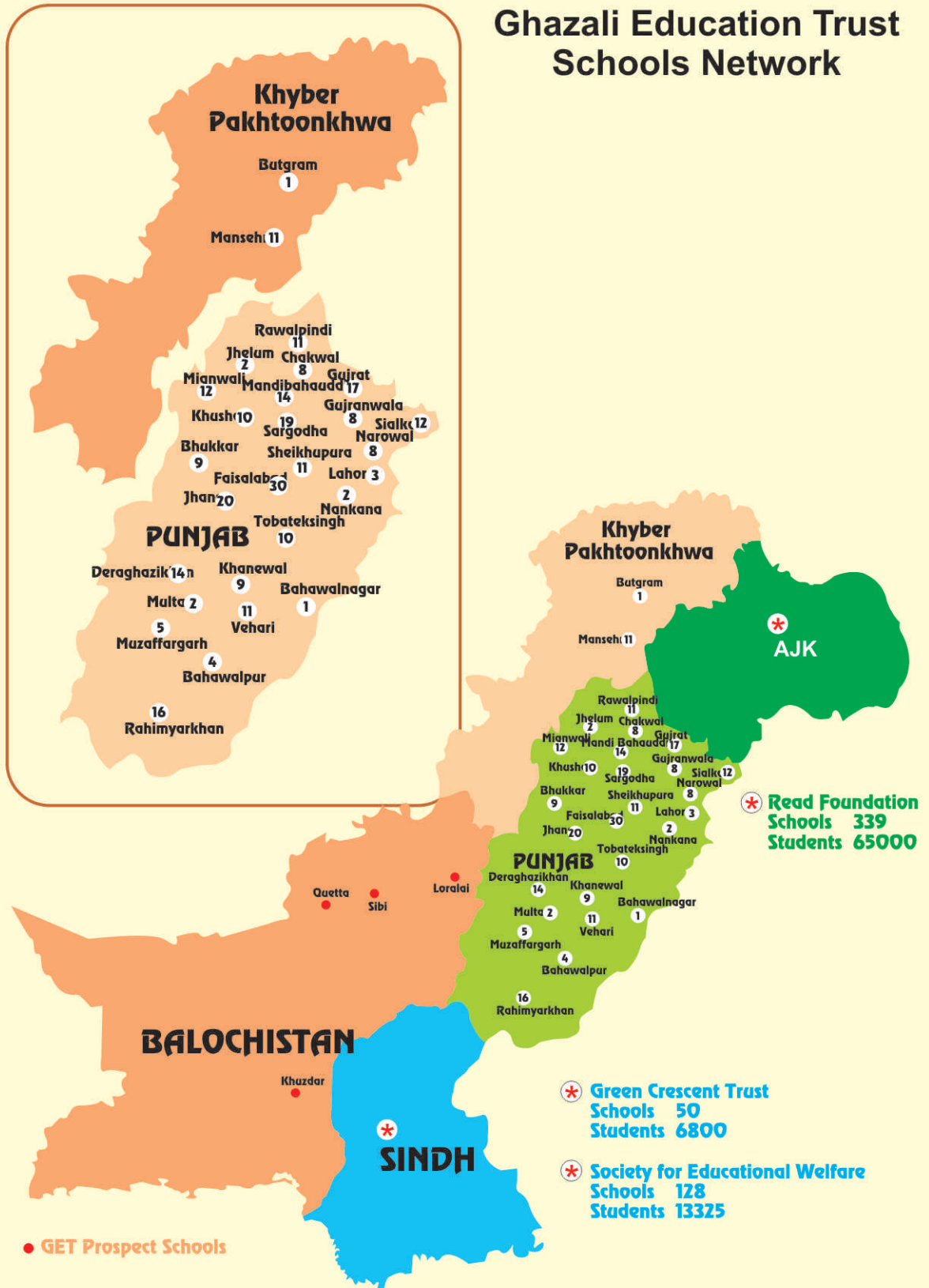

GET's Educational work for IDP's

GET is determined to spread light of knowledge all over where children cannot get education due to natural calamities and other turbulences such as the terrible earthquake in northern Pakistan. In such critical situation, GET instantly established schools in tents for the children of Balakot and Batgram to cope with their academic needs. With the passage of time, these tent schools were converted to buildings with the co-operation of GET and other NGO's where hundreds of children are still being educated.

The army operation in 2008/09 in north-western province against militants, forced the residents of Swat, Malakand, Dir and Swabi districts to leave their homes and towns. They were internally displaced and took shelter in camps in severe conditions of weather and lack of food and water. The elderly, women and children were most vulnerable in these conditions.

In view of the situation, GET established tent schools for the children of IDP's of Swat, Boner and Malakand in two major camps (Sheikh Yaseen Camp, Parhooti Camp). GET, along with other organizations, also established separate schools for girls and boys with morning and evening programs. In these

camps hundreds of children were able to get connected with their academic activities. In addition to rejoin their classroom routine, they were also imparted with hope, confidence and love.

It has been almost 5 years gone after the worst human tragedy occurred in Pakistan i.e. Earthquake 2005. Like many national and international organizations, GET took no time to approach the scene in its own area of interest. From make shift schools to temporary shelter and now with purpose build school campuses, Ghazali Education Trust is still active, alive, committed and delivering in earthquake affected areas.

GET along with FOF rose to the occasion to

educate the remaining children; the future generation of Pakistan.

Today, Alhamdulillah, with the active co-operation of FOF USA, GET is providing free education to all orphan/needy students in the earthquake hit areas. They also provided with books, bags, uniforms, shoes and other educational materials. FOF USA is also supporting GET to provide basic infrastructure in these schools like buildings and furniture. FOF is continually supporting 12 schools in the earthquake hit areas in which almost 1500 affected children are getting quality education. We acknowledge with thanks and appreciate the spirit, pace and achievements of FOF USA to help the orphan/needy girls particularly in the field of education.

GET School Building Provided by Foundation of the Faithful (FOF):

When the earthquake destroyed the native area of Balakot, the school buildings were also demolished or badly damaged. The educational process of these schools came to a complete halt. GET, keeping in view the interrupted academic career of hundreds of the earthquake affected students, decided to run the schools initially in camps, irrespective of the heat in the summer and severe cold in the winter. Children were provided with the opportunity to continue their studies even in such tormenting circumstances. Later, Ghazali Education Trust with the help of FOF worked on the project of constructing proper school buildings. As a result, two spacious school buildings were built in Bissian and Batkarar. These schools are adequately equipped with library and computer labs. These schools have vast playgrounds that give the students a healthy environment. GET School Batkarar has been shifted to newly constructed building



with 12 teachers and 250 students. Ghazali is also striving to improve the standard of moral education in these areas and once again a better educational process started. Ghazali provided them with a healthy educational environment and thus restored a peaceful life for them. These schools are a gift from FOF USA for the people of these areas.



(R&D) Research and Development

Research and Development (R&D) Department is changing the dreams into reality by training teachers into competent and accomplished role models at GET schools. They are also provided with a variety of teaching material. R&D organizes various types of training programs at both central and school level. We have an extensive teacher training centre in Lahore equipped with all the required facilities for central trainings where R&D organizes different subject-based master trainer's workshops for senior school teachers and principals. After undergoing the training,

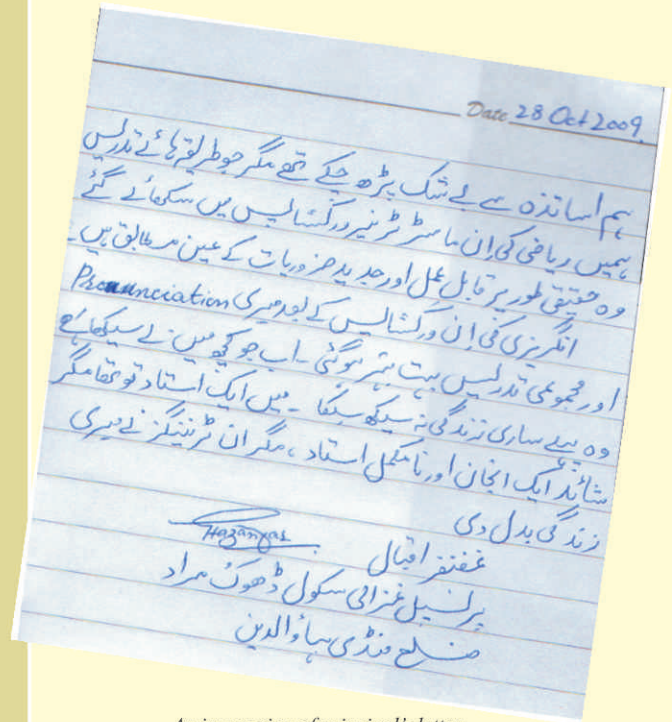


these master trainers conduct monthly school based training sessions for their local school teachers. This department also organizes school leadership, feh-m-e-din, management workshops for field managers and other training programs. It also provides model lesson plans, model papers, scheme of study, curricular, co-curricular and practical material to schools as teaching support.

R&D strengthens all departments of GET by developing quality assurance tools and carry out researches in order to find out the impact of these activities.

Impact Study

R&D Department initiated a unique activity during the year 2009. A three member team consisting of Mr. Aamir Shahzad (Joint Director Islami Nizam-e-Taleem Pakistan), Mr. Nadeem Ashraf Bajwa (In-charge R&D) and Mr. Farooq Gillani (Research Expert) was formed to visit 50 schools of Ghazali Education Trust in order to interview the teachers, students, local community members, parents, BOD members of Trust, DMS and even head office staff through a questionnaire. The purpose of this impact study is to evaluate the working process and assess the achievements of GET. It aims at examining the expectations of the stakeholders like teachers, students, donors and community members and surveying the fulfillment of such concerns. It focuses on the educational betterment and helps to determine the next step of Ghazali Education Trust.

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
